Jim A. Hennok Sales

Jim A. Hennok Ltd. issued 7 Private Treaty (PT) catalogues, starting with April '82, Nov. '82, July '83, Dec. '83, June '84, Oct. '84, CAPEX '87. Jim also issued various printed PT lists from 1952 to the early 1980's, but how many are not known. He also produced a few Canadian Wholesale used lists as well. In March, 1985, Jim issued his first stamp auction catalogue, and these are still being issued to date.

In 1975, Jim opened his first stamp store in late 1975 at 43 Adelaide St. East in Toronto. Jim had this store until September 1984 when he bought his current building at 185 Queen St. East and commenced the stamp auction business starting with the first stamp sale in March 1985. The auction sales have continued to date.

Popular Stamps, White Cover

Popular stamps, Vol. VIII No. 3, had the following message on page 4 of the April, 1945 issue:

"We regret that last issue about one-third of our edition had to be printed on white cover paper, and our whole edition this month will have the white cover. We prefer and have tried to maintain the India tint cover but, though this has been on order since first of the year, it has failed to arrive. We now learn that it will not be available until the middle of April—too late for this issue."

Notes in a Philatelic Library. by. B. T. K. Smith July 1912 Vol. V No. 3

THE CANADIAN COLLECTOR (Toronto, 1908)

This publication is described in the sub-title as "devoted to the interests of postage stamp collectors, curios, coins and kindred sciences," but the contents were entirely philatelic. Size 29 x 22 cm. The file consists of two numbers, paged consecutively-I., I "Advance copy" (September 1908), and I., I (November 1908). The "chief editor" was R. P. Douglas; proprietors, "a syndicate of well-known philatelists"; publishers, "The Canadian Collector Pub. Co.". The real publisher seems, however, to have been a Mr. MacAgy, (see Mekeel's Weekly Stamp News, 1909, p. 101, and Hobbyist, 1909, pp. 51, 115).

THE CANADIAN PHILATELIST (Rouleau, Sask, etc., 1910-11).

The file consists of Vol. I, 1-11 (April 1910-February 1911), and II, 1-3 (March-May 1911); Vol. I measures 19x12 cm., and Vol. II, 23x15 cm.; each number has a coloured wrapper; Vol. I was published at Rouleau by Andrew King, and Vol. II by Stephen Golder, at Regina, Sask. Each number contains, in addition to miscellaneous philatelic matter, a biography, with portrait, of some "Western Collector", as shown in the following list :-

In Vol. II, Nos. 1-2, is a transcription, by E. R. Aldrich, of an "Early postal treaty [1870] between U.S. and British Columbia.'

McLachlan & Co.'s Catalogue (1865).—The Crawford Catalogue gives an edition of 12pp. but a later

edition of 14pp. must have been prepared, if not actually issued, as the Alfred Smith Library contained a copy of "R. McLachlan & Co.'s Descriptive Price List and Catalogue of Postage Stamps." 14pp., with a label inscribed "Angus J. McIntosh's" pasted over the words "R. McLachlan & Co.'s", and McIntosh's name substituted in manuscript in the instructions. The wrapper, of blue surfaced paper, is inscribed "Descriptive Catalogue & Price List of British, Foreign & Colonial Postage Stamps for sale by Angus J. McIntosh, dealer, Montreal, Canada. Price post free . . . 10¢. Montreal; printed by M. Longmoore & Co., Gazette Steam Press. 1865."

With the copy in question was enclosed a letter of later date from Mr. McLachlan in which he says ".... Yes, I issued that catalogue in conjunction with D. W. Ross. After the catalogue was issued A. J. McIntosh was admitted into our partnership. I was first and foremost a collector and the others dealers first. And they exacted such high prices for the stamps I wanted that I found the partnership did not pay me, so dissolved. In the division of the stock McIntosh was accorded a number of catalogues and issued them with his own cover. I sold out my collection about 1870 and have ever since confined my collecting to coins, of which I have the largest collection in Canada."

MARKS STAMP CO. "Catalogue Canadian Revenue Stamps"; (2nd ed., Toronto, 1898). Gives a list and prices of Canadian and Provincial (British Columbia, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Ontario and Quebec) fiscal stamps and Canadian telegraph stamps.

SHOEMANN (S. M.). "A Check List of the Precanceled Postage Stamps of Canada"; (Paris, KY., 1912). The compiler divides the cancellations into 8 types, and then gives a list of 20 towns where they have been in use; there are two other types, described as being for general use.
