A Library List dated 1972 is available for a dollar and Class 9, on page 12, lists about 22 articles, or papers, which concern military philatelia. There have been many articles printed in Topics which are not listed and we suspect that some members have files of these. Has anyone a cumulative index of military articles that we could print?

The handbook, Roller Cancellations - 1894-1930 by E.A. Smythies, lists five early rollers as follows;-WILITARY CAMP POST CYFICES-

4 FIELD POST OFFICE NO 6
ALDERSHOT CAMP N.S. (1918)

2 FIELD P.O. No 1 NIAGARA CAMP ONT (1915)

5 FIELD P.O. NO PETAWAWA CAMP ONT (1918)

3 CAMP HUGHES MAN MILITARY CAMP (1915)

We have not seen any of these. Can a member provide details which can be passed on to the study group?

Among the early NWL2 military post office cancellations was this one and it was used at the locations shown:

201 Toronto, Ont.

301 Ottawa, Ont.

302 Barriefield, Ont.

8P 13 57 40 30P

No 303 Trenton, Ont. 501 Valcartier, P.Q.

601 Aldershot, N.S.

These first came into use in 1939 and 1940 and by the absence of a camp name fulfilled the requirement of military secrecy. Frequently however the sender's address was written on the front or back of the cover! Neat, attractive cancels measuring 24mm and not too easy to find. This reference is from Topics, for November 1945, page 89. Thanks to John Wilsdon for reminding us on this.


