1....Date slug error

One such item which must be unique concerns a cancel from Penhold, Alberta which reads--- MPO 1307 PENHOLD AM DE 17 Wd

Bill Robinson theorizes that clerk removed year slug after his noon lunch instead of AM and replaced it with PM (inverted). Stamp is Scott's 257. Fas anyone another of these and can the year of usage be determined from a backstamp? Bill has sent much other finely detailed information which will aid the Group in the future.

4.... Postal Corps-Boer War

Wayne Curtis sends this historic item which he found in "The Canadian Contingents" by W. Sanford Evans, 1901, pages 129 and 130.

quote: "On the Laurentian, which reached Cape Town on February 17th, went D and E Batteries, a small detachment of the 2nd Battalion of the Mounted Rifles, and fourteen attached officers, nurses and men. Among those attached was a postal corps of five men. At the time the first contingent was being organised the Canadian Post Office Devartment had offered to the Imperial Government a postal corps for the special work of handling the mail for the Canadians in the field; but the offer was not accepted until just before the second contingent was sent. Canada's example in this respect was followed in Australia and India. After the corps had been two months in South Africa Major

Treble, commanding Army Post Office Corps, wrote to Hon. Mr. Mulock, Cdn. Postmaster General, that, "the Canadian Staff, under the supervision of Captain Ecclestone, had proved very efficient, and besides relieving me of all work in connection with the Canadian troops, has rendered valuable assistance in the work generally". Unquote.

5....Little Norway

With reference to Topics-June-July 1974 page 124 we have reports of 12 cancels from Toronto-Little Norway and 4 from Little Norway.

6.... Receiver's Marking-Siberian Expeditionary Force An East Coast BNAFSer gives us permission to tell members that he has just found a second example of the marking traced below-

SERAGE

see reference in Lowe's, Vol 5 page 315, para CS-5. Tracing is about full size. The usage of this marking took place 56 years ago this month. A remarkable find.


