CHRISTMAS DAY 1915 GREETINGS FROM FRANCE



This unofficial, rather plain post card was sent by a member of the C.E.F. ("B.E.F." on the reverse) and presumably from one of the 29th Infantry Battalion's "Tobin's Tigers". The 29th was part of the 6th Canadian Brigade in 1915 within the 2nd Canadian Division. Field Post Office 6.X, according to Bailey & Toop (Canadian Military Posts, Colonial Period To 1919, Vol.I. Ed. E.B.


Proud, 1984, p. 191) was located in the Vierstraat area in France from September 23 to December 23. The CM3 triangle censor No. 2192 (in carmine) is confirmed by F.W. Daniel's "The Field Censorship System and the Canadians, 1914-1919" (\underline{ibid} , p. 264) for the 29th Battalion. The message reads:

"B.E.F./Dec. 23rd

Thanks very much for your most useful gift. Hope you are enjoying the festive season and your holidays. We are in fairly comfortable quarters at present and are not having a bad time of it in spite of much rainy weather. Best wishes for the New Year. D.R.H."

Unfortunately, as is often the case, I had just recently sold my copy of The 29th (Vancouver) Battalion, C.E.F.: A Pictorial Record and Original Muster Roll by John N. McLeod (1919) just prior to purchasing this card so further research on it will have to wait!

CANADIAN CIVILIAN USE OF "ON ACTIVE SERVICE" ENDORSEMENT DURING THE KOREAN WAR--By Mike Street



The card illustrated above, postmarked at British FPO 734 (Seoul) on October 6, 1954 and at CFPO-25 (Seoul) the next day, was sent "On Active Service" by an entertainer in "Canadian Concert Party No.6". The first Canadian Concert Party featuring well-known comedians Johnny Wayne and Frank Shuster, accompanied by musicians and other entertainers, arrived in Korea on March 28, 1953 [1]. They proved very popular with the Canadians serving in Korea; so much so that by the fall of 1954 at least six Concert Parties had toured there.

"Hello Jack,

Just thought I'd send a card from Korea. We visited this park [2] this afternoon. Ross Bertram [3] and Marie Demers [4] are here too. We've done 2 shows a day for 2 months. Very hard on the voice. We live in tents & travel in trucks. Rough but OH the wonderful audiences. We'll all be spoiled to just work for money.



Second Canadian Military Postal History Anthology Proposed by Mike Street

In 1991, to celebrate the 100th issue of the *Newsletter*, members of the Canadian Military Mail Study Group worked together to produce *The Canadian Military Postal History Anthology*, a 240-page collection of articles on subjects ranging from the North-West Rebellion to the Boer War through Militia Camps, WWI, the Siberian Expedition, and many aspects of WWII. The late Ken Ellison edited the volume. Shortly before Ken passed away this summer his daughter Liz contacted me and asked if Ken's WWII Special Forces (aka the Devil's Brigade) exhibit would be worth publishing. An immediate "YES" by email was followed by the thought that a terrific way to honour all of Ken's efforts on behalf of the CMMSG would be to make this exhibit the first submission for a second *Canadian Military Postal History Anthology*.

Much new information on Canadian Military Postal History has come to light since publication of the first anthology, and new postal history has been generated by the Peacekeeping missions in Bosnia, Serbia and Afghanistan. II" was well-received by those present. The effort to keep Canadian
money in Canada to help pay the huge costs of World War II was extensive. Postmasters cleared some letters at local post offices and financial institutions certified their own mail, while a large number of
inspectors at offices across the country opened and reviewed the contents of randomly-selected mail not passed by other offices.

The next CMMSG meeting will be held at BNAPEX 2017/CALTAPEX in Calgary next Labour Day weekend.

2016 E.R. "RITCH" TOOP MEMORIAL AWARD RECIPIENTS

This year's award for the best book or article on Canadian or B.N.A. military mail was presented to BRIAN PLAIN, GRAY SCRIMGEOUR, and ROBERT TOOMBS for their editorship of the Lt.Col. Roland H. Webb book, A Guide to Canadian Military Postal History, 1636-1970. It is an excellent work and congratulations are extended to all of the recipients.

Our member "down-under", David Collyer, emailed:

"Thank you for Newsletter 223; always interesting reading. In regards to the Swiss item on page 1459 [NL #223, March 2016.Ed.], I think the 1.30SFr equated to $30 \not\in UPU/Foreign$ Letter Rate (per 20g) + $70 \not\in air$ (per 5g) + $30 \not\in Registration$ fee.

Using aircraft movements data from Aitink and Hovenkamp (bridging the continents in wartime), you have an arrival marking at New York of October 17, 1941. This is PAA service 436 from Lisbon on October 16, Azores the same day. Bermuda October 17 and New York the same day. The even numbered flights were from Lisbon and the odd numbered flights were from New York.


If mail was held over at Bermuda for inspection by the British Censors, the likely services would have been:

- --430 Lisbon October 9, Azores October 9/10, Bermuda and New York on October 11
- --432 Lisbon October 11, Azores October 11/12, Bermuda and New York on October 13 [Cont'd.]

--434 Lisbon October 12, Azores October 12, Bermuda and New York on October 13

In regards to the article on 109 (Pathfinder) Squadron, D.C.T. (Donald Clifford Tyndall) Bennett was born at Toowoomba west of Brisbane on September 14, 1910, and died on September 15, 1986. Before 109 Squadron, Bennett assisted in setting up the Atlantic Ferry Organization."






GREETINGS FROM TEXAS -- By David Hanes

[Dave sent along scans of the following postcard from H. Flewelling to (presumably) his father in Ontario. In June 1917 American cadets came to Canada for training, and in exchange Canadians with the Royal Flying Corps travelled to Texas for training in the winter months. Camp Taliaferro near Fort Worth was chosen, along with its three aerodromes: Hicks, Everman, and Benbrook fields.

Ken Ellison illustrated a similar Christmas card but his appears to be somewhat different with a dimpled border and background ("RFC/RAF Canada Christmas Post Cards 1917-18," BNA Topics, Vol.46, No.6 (Whole No. 434), Nov.-Dec. 1989, p.27) which is also illustrated. His article is an excellent study.Ed.]









"A MERRY XMAS" R.A.F./R.F.C.


Here's a cover to the C.O. of the R.C.A.F. Station in Gander, Newfoundland.





CANADIAN NURSING SISTER AT SHEPHEARD'S HOTEL, CAIRO 1916--By John

[We haven't run a nursing sister cover for a few issues and John sent along one from Nursing Sister Tuckett [Trickett?] to her sister [?] in Toronto. It bears a Base Army Post Office/B/8 [or 18?] JA/16 postmark. The return address of "No.21 General Hospital" is not a Canadian one so presumably this nursing sister was seconded to a British hospital. I've tried to locate this nursing sister among my rolls but was unsuccessful. Do other members have any more information on her? The Base Office was at Alexandria so she must have been on leave in Cairo or?

Upon further thinking about this cover, my memory was tweaked and it happens I too have a similar cover ($\underline{NL\#162}$, Nov. 2003, p. 709)! It was also from her in Alexandria. Jon Johnson, in $\underline{NL\#164}$ (March 2004, p.740) noted that he too has a cover from her identified "P.L. Tuekett" with the Q.A.I. M.N.S.R. (Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service, Reserve). For another associated medical cover and the Shepheard's Hotel see $\underline{NL\#133}$ (Jan. 1998, p. 325).Ed.]
