#### C.12n INFERNATIONAL HARVESTER COMPANY - CTTAWA.

The following are necessary changes to the tentative die arrangement sheet which appeared on Pages 2-3 of the Oct./84 Perforator. These changes are the result of new information and stamp designs submitted by Jean-Guy Dalpe for further study and comment. For those Members who have studied the first reconstruction chart and were able to identify some of their 'Bellevilles' to the Ottawa Office user, the revised chart will enable those interested to place all damaged dies and collect such as varieties, with and without code holes.

STATE I: Move 'Complete' Die (3) into Die (1) space and show the present Die (1) with missing hole at H-5 position as a progression from its parent complete die. Up to now, my piece with #109 dated, is the sole stamp item discovered, and this possibly short lived damage could well be resting in collections on other stamps such as #107 unobserved.

Insert in the blank Die (3) space a new early damaged design on #106 with a 1914 date, missing holes at C-13, H-6-12, and I-1.

- Notes: (1) All State I designs still have the Ottawa Code Hole 9 intact.
  - (2) Joe Furcell's #109 block of four recorded under Die (2) is now confirmed in its place since it places the two vertical and 'complete' designs in the correct adjoining position of Die (1).
  - (3) #89 stamp recorded in the complete die stamps, and #109 added under Die (5), both examined and in Dalpe's collection.

STATE II: Move 'Complete Die' (1) to Die (5) position and move each of Dies (2)(3)(4) one position to the left. The remaining design in the previous Die (5) with missing holes recorded under Index No.2(2)(3) are now believed to be a progression of the recorded Index No.10, 10(2), with missing holes at C-4 and H-2. Thus the progressive break of Index No.2(2)(3) is now shown at the bottom of Die (1) of the new chart. vacant Die (4) space has been filled with a 'complete' die design, the two complete dies now adjoining in positions (4) and (5). Jean-Guy has just submitted a horizontal pair of #231 both with complete dies, and this first evidence of two complete dies in simultaneous use on a pair caused a lot of the shifting and revisions to State II above. This insignificant pair also answers the problem I recognized on paper of why we seemed to have such a complete range of numbers from #150 to #257 with 'complete' designs, while the other dies in State II with damage were much less in proportion. This observation led to correspondence and after mentioning that 1937 issues nearly all perfin designs appeared 'complete', J.G. suggested that perhaps further repair had taken place and should a State III be considered?

I agree completely with the proposal of a State III status with the repair of the missing holes under Index No.10, No.11 and the old No. 2(2)(3), now a progression of No.10(2) in about 1936-37. This also ties in with the reason why the missing code holes under the recorded Indexes have not surfaced beyond the 1935 Jubilees and regular 1935 issues. The State III complete designs have very regular and beautifully machined pin holes as with the examples seen in late 1936 & '37.

STATE III: Jean Guy has also submitted a completely new damage with code hole present of this new State III with missing holes at C-3, H-7-8-11 as illustrated under the complete Dies (4)(5) of State II, #233. This damage should also continue on to the end of the War Issue, and Members having a similar damage to a stamp other than #233, please let me know for the recording of this most interesting and rewarding project.








