In the last month I have had 2 requests for information regarding the various overprints on the Manitoba Law Stamps. There is no reason for illustrating these stamps as the various Revenue Catalogs contain very good illustrations.

MANITOBA LAW STAMPS

Used from May 1, 1877 to June 1, 1901

The stamps when printed were overprinted either C. F. or L.S. meaning "The Consolidated Fund" or "The Law Society Fund".

Stamps of varying values of these two varieties, as fixed by order in Council, were to be affixed to all legal documents, beginning May 1, 1877.

The use of L.S. stamps was abolished April 29, 1884, and of C.F. stamps July 1, 1886.

On July 1, 1886, two new funds were created:

"The Administration of Justice Fee Fund" - "J.F."

"The Building Fund" - "B.F."

The use of "B.F." stamps was abolished March 5, 1889 and of "J.F. stamps on May 30, 1892.

After that date no overprint was required. Stamps bearing two overprints are explained by the fact that when the use of "L.S." and "C.F." was abolished, the stamps still in stock which had been printed with the letters "L.S. or "C.F." were still used but were overprinted with either "J.F." or "B.F." as required.
