Canadian Prisoner of War Camp 130 (Kananaskis, Alberta) used cent, five, 10 and 50 cent notes; also \$1 and \$5 in a 1946 issue. Lethbridge, Alberta, Camp 133, and Medicine Hat, Alberta, Camp 132, also issued "canteen chits," a form of scrip used by internees and POW inmates in various Canadian camps.

Denominations: 1c (no serial number) and \$1 (with serial number).


Second Issue: black print on blue cardboard. All except the 1c have a black

Date: Expires on Sept. 30th (year?). Denominations: 1c. 5c. 10c. 25c and \$1.

All are made of pink cardboard; the 1c is rectangular and the rest are in the style of theater tickets. Printer for all except the 1c is Bulman Bros., Winnipeg. All are undated.


