NEWFOUNDLAND: 1840 - 1949 Postal Markings issued to St. John's General Post Office and Sub Post Offices

Purpose: to only show 1840 - 1949 St. John's Postal Markings originating from devices in use there.

Scope: This marcophily exhibit presents all known marking device types issued to the general post office and sub post offices in the city of St. John's, the capital city of Newfoundland. They extend from 1840 when St. John's joined the Imperial Postal System until 1949 when Newfoundland joined confederation with Canada. On a mailed object these markings denote passage through the delivery system at that specific location. Two status cancel colours were applied: red = paid; black = unpaid.

Treatment: organization is by 17 marking types and each type is presented chronologically.

This letter dated July 04, 1854 has the signature of William Solomon.

He was first Postmaster General of Newfoundland serving from the St. John's General Post Office in 1840 to 1860. In 1857 he introduced Newfoundland's first adhesive postage stamps.

Research: the initial 10 bar obliterating device was made from brass. Those immediately following were made having a metal rim with cork inserts. With use these cork inserts quickly deteriorated. This degradation makes finding full intact markings a challenge. This is a particular problem usually seen in the years 1865 - 1885. Where necessary some delineated facsimiles were made to present the full marking. All recorded marking types are presented. From discovery research by this exhibitor there have been found 16 new markings. These are displayed and marked with *discovery* indicator. In Frame 3 are displayed the reported St. John's postal paid markings. Within this group are included those that are termed as 'outport' postal paid markings. These are found sporadically utilized in the St. John's postoffice complex.

In 1857 from England came Newfoundland's first obliterator. This device had a ten bar format and it was issued to those post offices then in service.

Those shown were used in St. John's from 1857 - 1949. Later in 1918, electric rapid cancelling machines were installed at the St. John's G.P.O. The speed and performance of these machines negated the use of the obliterators. Only four examples have been found used after 1918.

The metal rimmed cancellers from 1865 were reused in the 1869 - 1880 era. They are found with various inserts: leafs; circle of squares; sunburst in the middle of St. John's Newfoundland. Both the unpaid and paid cancel were utilized. These devices rarely see as a complete cancel.







Many problems hindered the ability of the G.P.O. to keep adequate supplies of low denomination stamps on hand. To eke out supplies it was often necessary to issue provisional cancel markings. The first marking was a PAID ALL handstamp that was applied to local and internal mail. Payment was

taken over the counter in cash.





The triangular handstamp POSTAGE PAID was used by the armed forces at St. John's during the Second World War. Its use was thought to diminish the enemies knowledge of the armed forces using the port as a base of operations initially shown.

After the Canadian Army Post offices closed in 1946 these triangle cancels were utilized locally.

MACHINE CANCELS

Machine cancels came into use at the G.P.O. with the installation of two INTERNATIONAL company devices in 1910. These cancelling machines were in constant use from 1910 - 1949.



MACHINE CANCELS

The intermittent curve mark under the time slug in the hub-dater was caused by the latch on the machine that hold the month/day dies in place. The explanation for this mark is found from research by Bob Payne where he says it occurs as: 'an operator error when doing the relatching'.




MACHINE SLOGAN CANCELS

MACHINE METER CANCELS

Meter machines were purchased and serviced by local business. The firms had to bring their machine to the G.P.O. to be unlocked and filled with postage credit. Before being returned to the owner they were relocked and sealed. The meter machine could do multiple denominations and would do a countdown of stamp credits each time it was used until empted.





MONEY ORDER OFFICE

Money Order facilities were established in St. John's by 1864. Being part of the G.P.O. it came to be referred to as the Money Order Branch or Department; with MOO MOB MOD abbreviations observed on the cancel devices. My finding was of a datestamp found as a double circle dated August 10, 1864. It was found amongst a lot of St. John's double split circles which had been cut from a G.P.O. ledger book. It is similar to the Pritchards-Andrews proof strike example of 1879. My finding

has a short T in St. while the proof has a long T in ST.

TOO LATE

If a letter was posted within one hour of the close of the mail clerks wicket the posted mail it was held until the next mailing, usually the following day. If the sender wished to enable their mail to go out on the days despatch they were required to pay an extra fee termed Late Fee. If that fee was not paid, the mail was held until the following day mail posting. A marking TOO LATE was applied to the envelope. This was done so as to give notice to the recipient who would have wondered why the mail they were expecting had not arrived by the anticipated time.





The air mail rate from Newfoundland did not change until 1945. All mail with the 7 cent air mail stamp released in 1943 was struck with one of two handstamps between 1945 - 1949 if short on air mail postage fees.

This cancel was applied to mail going to Great Britain, Canada, United States, foreign and any urgent letters. They were often sent by diplomatic pouch and by first means available.

When required the G.P.O. opened the mail to try and determine the sender's correct address. If this was unsuccessful, the mail was passed to the Dead Letter Office. They in turn did due diligence to find to whom to direct that particular piece of mail. The Dead Letter Office then would reseal the envelope and mark it in manner to identifying that the mail had been officially opened. When resealed the letter was initially cancelled with a variety of cancels and later labels were affixed.

Another technique employed by the Post Office was the for the Post Office to place in the local newspaper a special advertisement notice. It stated that mail for the stated individuals was being held at the G.P.O. for a specified time. The held mail had ADVERTISED NOT CALLED FOR cancel applied to the piece of mail. The list was renewed every two weeks. If unclaimed the mail would be returned to sender. If no return address it was given to the Dead Letter Office to handle.





Another enhancement by the Dead Letter Office was the use of specially marked envelopes to enable the return of undeliverable letters to the senders. Several sized formula envelopes were developed that had 2 CENTS DUE RETURNED LETTER in various sizes and placements on the envelopes.



The growth of St. John's during the later half of the 1900s exerted pressure on the G.P.O. to instigate enlarging the city postal needs. In the 1885 - 1908 time period to expand mail service several sub offices were opened. More offices into new areas were required as the city continued to expand.
