

Canadian Dead Letter Office Reorganization Handstamps



Purpose:

The exhibit shows the **new style rectangle Dead Letter Office handstamps** due to a major **Post Office reorganization in 1948**. Onward, all mail directed to several Dead Letter Offices **were to be sent only to Montreal**, **Toronto** and **Vancouver** depending upon the point of origin and destination. Mail containing valuables that could not be redirected and mail suspected of being illegal or of a fraudulent nature would be forwarded to the Dead Letter Office in **Ottawa**.

Treatment:

In January 1948 Ottawa was the first Dead Letter Office to be restructured according to the dates on proofs, followed by Montreal, Toronto and finally Vancouver in July 1948. The Dead Letter Offices will be shown in this order. Additional proofs were made at subsequent dates up to November 1948, including replacement proofs up to 1952. A gradual reduction in use occurred in 1953 and 1954. There are a few proofs after 1948 but not of this particular design, thus not included in this study.

Items are usually listed by type, dimensions, lettering including periods, commas and dashes. This will result in a general chronological order, but not for every item.

The listing for each item includes the lettering of the handstamp and indicia, major and subtype of handstamp, dimensions, important variations as compared to similar handstamps, if a strike proof was taken and importance such as Previously Unknown, Only Known Copy (**OKC**) or Earliest (**ERD**) and Latest (**LRD**) reported dates of use. Throughout the exhibit are numerous previously unknown, unreported, earliest and latest reported dates discovered by the exhibitor.

The Dead Letter Office is an important division of the Canadian Post Office as it would not be able to function without the clearing of undeliverable items. These handstamps are new and the last mainly used by the DLO before the name change to the Undeliverable Mail Office (UMO).

Ottawa Dead Letter Office

In 1948 eleven Ottawa DLO rectangle proof strikes were produced numbered 1 to 11. Of the eleven only five of the numbered handstamps have been reported to date. The earliest being Feb 8, 1949 and latest Feb 12, 1954. Ten reports of the five handstamps are all that are known at this time.

A replacement handstamp #10 was proofed Sep 8, 1950 with periods after the day and month similar to handstamps #7 & #11, with only one copy of each reported to date.


All handstamps are single frame with dimensions of 46mmx35mm, sans-serif and capitalized.





Montreal Dead Letter Office

In 1948 twelve Montreal DLO rectangle proof strikes were produced numbered 1 to 12. Of the twelve all are now recorded as used. The earliest being Aug 6, 1948 and latest Mar 16, 1954.

All handstamps are single frame with dimensions of 47mmx35mm, sans-serif and capitalized.

Replacement handstamps with the month spelled out numbered 2, 3 and 9 have been reported, with no overlapping of older handstamps. Numbers 2 and 9 were proofed on OCT 25 1950, no proof strike is known for the number 3 handstamp. Dimensions are 46mmx35mm for all number 2 handstamps, and 47mmx35mm for number 3 and 9 handstamps.



Toronto Dead Letter Office

In 1948 seven Toronto DLO rectangle proof strikes were produced numbered 1 to 7. Of the seven only four of the numbered handstamps have been reported to date. The earliest being Dec 22, 1948 and latest Nov 20, 1953. Seven reports of the four handstamps are only known at this time.

All handstamps are single frame with dimensions of 47mmx35mm, sans-serif and capitalized.

A **replacement handstamp #10** has been reported, with the month spelled out, no proof known. Only one copy has been reported to date for Jan 28, 1952. Dimensions 48mmx33mm.





Opened by Mistake Dead Letter Branch Los Angeles, Calif.

Four Officially Sealed labels applied to reseal the cover then returned to Canada to the Toronto Dead Letter Office Jan 25, 1952, per Pitney Bowes meter machine imprint. **Opened by No. 10** DLO clerk in Toronto and handstamped with **No. 10 subsequent rectangle handstamp**, returned to sender in Return Dead Letter envelope.



Vancouver Dead Letter Office

In 1948 seven Vancouver DLO rectangle proof strikes were produced numbered 1 to 7. All the numbered handstamps have been reported to date. The earliest being July 8, 1948 and latest June 12, 1954. Fewer than 10 of each have so far been reported.

All above handstamps are single frame with dimensions of 46.5mmx35mm distinctly different than the other cities numbered handstamps. The lettering is sans-serif and capitalized.


There is a replacement handstamp #6 with the month spelled out, proofed SEP 25 1952 with dimensions of 47mmx34mm. Only three copies have been reported to date all owned by this exhibitor.



Of the six different ink colours used on DLO handstamps all are known for the Vancouver office: black, violet, red, purple, blue and green.

From April 8, 1954 Flight 9 Montreal to Vancouver collided with a T33 NATO jet trainer leaving Winnipeg to Edmonton leg,





This is a much different hammer than the previous numbered DLO handstamps. It is a different size and the date is spelled out rather than Roman numerals

Also, there is no period after 'CANADA'



In mid-1954 the Dead Letter Office (DLO) name changed to the Undeliverable Mail Office (UMO) resulting in the decommissioning of these types of handstamps.
