BNAPS ONLINE PUBLICATIONS-TOPICS AND CUMULATIVE INDEX

The BNAPS Board approved placing the entire TOPICS volumes up to 5 years ago in an online searchable database at the BNAPS website http://www.bnaps.org . In a letter to the editor of the upcoming Portraits, Dale Spiers castigates this decision as gutting the benefits of BNAPS for members. Those in favor felt the education mission of the Society was supported by making our knowledge base more available, and the five year lag would retain those who want current or new information. Spiers suggested that the Study Groups were not much of a benefit, and on this point I think he is quite mistaken. Joining BNAPS just to get Study Group newsletters should be a major inducement for anyone who is serious about a specialty area. There was no movement toward adding the Study Group newsletters, although that info is much more detailed and inaccessible now than TOPICS, which can be obtained through APS in any case.

The search function is based on the cumulative index developed by Charles Livermore. Under copyright law, BNAPS can make available the entire volume set, which it owns, as long as individual

articles, which may be copyrighted by the author, are not separated out for listing or reproduction. Fair use laws allow individual copying for limited use. With the potential of the IRS to breath down BNAPS's neck on its income and expenditures, the Society clearly needs to create and support more educational activities such as the handbook publications, books, outreach programs, etc.

THE CEYLON FIND

One of the most important correspondences of the last 50 years recently surfaced. A cover was put up on ebay that had 22c postage paid with 2c and 4x5c Small Queens dated 1877 to Ceylon. It took me about 2 minutes to figure out this was a previously unrecorded rate and destination. While the date was correct for the 20c rate via Brindisi, the 2c extra was for the US routing via New York. No such rate to India, Burma, Ceylon, or Singapore has previously been recorded (see pic on next page).

Fellow BNAPSer Bill Radcliffe put a marker bid on it, and after a couple days the lot suddenly was withdrawn. About a half day later Dealer Bill Longley sent an email with a listing of almost a dozen covers to Ceylon, about with the pre-UPU rate and half at the post-UPU 10c per half oz. rate. Many were multiple weight frankings. This listing includes:

Longley apparently contacted the owner of the ebay cover and convinced him to sell the entire correspondence. Apparently the owner is an elderly fellow, a direct descendent of the correspondents, who owned a coffee company in Ceylon. Bill Radcliffe was offered for sale the double weight of May 1879, an outstanding cover. I couldn't properly edit it from the acrobat file but will bring it on a laptop for those who want to see all the covers at the Jan. meeting.

PARCEL POST MANIA In the "when it rains it pours" division, I have had the opportunity to buy three important parcel post items in the last couple months after having gone after Horace Harrison's material last year. I am happy to report that these new items were the equal of what Horace had in the comparable periods. In addition, all three had 15c Large Queens as part of the frankings, which significantly improved my variety of frankings in the parcel post area. I can now show frankings with the 5c and 12 ½ c Decimals, ½ c, 1c red, 3c, 5c, 12 ½ c, and 15c Large Queens. 1c, 3c, 5c, 6c and 10c Small Queens, 50c Widow Weed, 20c Edward, along with 5c RLS. In 5th class I can show 1c, 2c, 3c, and 10c Small Queens along with 5c RLS, as well as 1c and 5c Jub, as well as assorted Leaf and Numeral issues. Shown on the next page are some of these new acquisitions.

In Harrison's book on Canadian registration, he comments that parcel post items with the 5c RLS are scarce to rare. The top piece has an 1888 date, and the 15c is a nice shade of blue. The bottom piece includes a ½ c Large Queen, one of only a couple items (Horace had another) with that stamp. Both items pay the triple 6c rate per 4 oz. The third item shown is a 25c franking in the period when the rate was 12 ½ c per lb prior to 1879. It is dated 1868 with 15c, 1c, and three 3c Large Queens, all tied by 4 ring 47 cancels of Three Rivers.
