Welcome to this issue of the Canadian Dead Letter Office newsletter. Summer is well upon us and BNAPEX 2010 in Victoria is fast approaching. This promises to be a great event and I hope there we will be able to see several of our members attend. A DLO Study Group meeting is booked and this will provide an early opportunity to exchange information and obtain suggestions for future newsletters.

With a few exceptions, Canadian DLO material remains an uncommon commodity in dealer's stocks. Likewise, items appear infrequently on eBay and other on-line sites. When one does find a cover, the prices are generally reasonable, likely representing unfamiliarity with the scarcity of some of this material. For those interested in a new philatelic side-line, this is the time to consider the Dead Letter Office.

This writer has been working to update the three databases (Pre-1898, 1898-1953, and the UMO) and it is hoped that they will be ready for printing at Victoria. New finds are being made, many of which are filling gaps in the listings that have long been anticipated.

Material from the Undeliverable Mail Office is beginning to appear, and many markings seem to be quite scarce. As I have mentioned previously, it is likely that cancellations and hand stamps from the DLO and UMO repose in 'other' collections, where they appear as curiosities that require further explanation. We look forward to seeing you in Victoria, September 2nd to 5th.

Dead Letter Office Forms, Cards and Slips

Similar to the General Post Office, the Dead Letter Office had its own regulations and with them their own Envelopes, Forms, Cards and Slips to facilitate the ease of handling Dead Letter Office mail matter.

Seen below are a few Dead Letter Office forms used specifically by the DLO or by the Post Office for items to be sent to the DLO.

To Accompany All Articles Found Loose in the Mail

2D.L. (g) -25M-19-4-50 Articles found loose in the mails could either be thrown in by error or have been separated from an envelope or parcel during transit. If the items could not be returned to rightful owner they would end up in the DLO auctions. 25,000 copies of this form were printed in 1950.

BECAUSE if your name and address are on the outside of any article that cannot be delivered, it will be PROMPTLY RETURNED to you UNOPENED.

Undeliverable articles WITHOUT your name and address on the outside have to go to the DEAD LETTER OFFICE, causing delay and inconvenience.
