




### <u>DLOS – 5</u>

In a close examination of the proof book<sup>i</sup> one may find an interesting deviation from the normal; a strike in which the side arcs are not solid but rather consist of a series of five small dots. This pattern is not repeated in any other proof. The proofing date (Figure 1) appears to be FE 1 (18)83. The database listing is shown below.

This cover was mailed at Hamilton on August 4<sup>th</sup> 1888. Sent to Paris (Ontario) it was held for three months before being declared undeliverable. In keeping with postal regulations, the reason for non-delivery was marked on the front of the cover [NOT CALLED FOR] before it was sent to the Dead Letter Office in Ottawa. It arrived at the DLO on November 1<sup>st</sup> and was processed by clerk #1. Following completion of activity by the DLO it was returned to the regular mail stream on November 17<sup>th</sup>. The completion of DLO involvement is signified by the application of the DLOS-5 handstamp.

Figure 4 is the earliest reported date June 5 1888 of this handstamp, on an unclaimed, advertised cover in the United States. All reported copies appear to be from 1888 as handstamps may not have been put into use when they were proofed.

Posted Toronto March 1 1888 to Brooklyn, New York, Figure 4. Advertised a month later as 'UNCLAIMED' with postage due applied for advertising fee (not paid) Figure 5, and forwarded to the US DLO Apr 19 - 88, then to the Ottawa DLO JU 5 1888.

New Handstamp by Gary Steele



Many handstamps have similar appearance, however, the dimensions can be significantly different. Some may vary by 10mm or more whereas others may be by just a few millimeters. In the illustration shown above, the upper post card the  $2^{nd}$  oval to the right is overlaid with the left oval of the lower post card. Clearly the letters do not match up and the ovals now show three lines. The upper item is 2mm less in width causing this difference.

With rubber handstamps there is always the possibility that they can stretch due to wear and and the force behind the strike. In this case I do not think this is the reason. Both items are from 1907 so one would assume there to be little change in wear if they were the same handstamp. One may then assume this to be a previously unknown handstamp.

Franked with a U.S. stamp, on Dec 23 1907, this post card was RETURNED FOR / POSTAGE due and sent to the Vancouver DLO. Upon receipt of the missing postage, it was franked with a 1 cent Edward Jan 6 1908 and returned to the regular mail stream for dispatch to Montana where it was received on Jan 6 1908.
