Do we like more stamps being issued by Canada? Sure we do! Every new issue is a part of the Elizabethan era — right up our alley. Here is what Canada Post is up to these days...

Postal Rates To Rise

Canada Post has proposed postal rate increases for January 15, 2007:

Domestic Lettermail: to 52¢ (from current 51¢)

USA: to 93¢ (from current 89¢)

International: to \$1.55 (from current \$1.49)

A new group of definitives is sure to be forthcoming in late December to meet these new rates. It would be great if Canada Post keeps the same floral theme.


Prepaid postal cards

Canada Post is certainly not letting up on the release of Prepaid postal cards.

No less than five different stamp issues will have corresponding postal cards released sharing the same design as the postage stamps. In each instance, there are multiple stamp designs with each issue. The result is twelve different Prepaid postal cards:

- Year of the Dog (2 cards)
- (4 cards) • Canadian Forces
- Snowbirds (2 cards)
- Duck Decoys (4 cards)

Each non-denominated postal card sells for \$1.69 (plus GST) and is good for mailing anywhere in the world.

New Postal Rates Book

Delayed ... Andrew Chung informs us that *The Postal Rates and Fees of The Elizabethan Era From Canada 1952–2005, Volume Two,* is still in the final proofing stages. It has been delayed but should be ready for printing by the end of December (with delivery in January?).

We have been advertising the first volume (Domestic Rates) here in the *Corgi Times* for the past year or so. This is the companion volume, featuring International Rates. There will be about 250 pages divided into three sections: Canadian Forces mail, United States of America, and International (non-USA).

Canada Post's *Details* magazine notes that the illustration of the lacrosse player on the World Lacrosse stamp (Sc. 2161) issued Jul 6th was inspired by a photograph that designer Tom Yakobina found on the cover of a thirty-year old book (1976) called *Lacrosse: Technique and Tradition*.


Illustrated here is the stamp, the book cover (by Robert Scott), and the back of the stamp booklet cover.

It seems that the players being illustrated are all Americans. The original photograph is of a 1974 championship game when John Hopkins University beat the University of Maryland, 17-12, in a game played at Rutgers Stadium.

The figure on the stamp is Dino A. Mattessich of the University of Maryland.


Thus, Canada's National Sport is honoured by illustrating an American!



New LA Perfins


ESG member Larry Margetish has forwarded the following email...

"I've already forwarded the information to both the BNAPS and APS perfins study groups (see notes below).

Since my copy of Corgi Times arrived today, I noticed that you are interested in ALL aspects of Elizabethan stamps, so I'm including you.

What has happened is I purchased a perfin cover through eBay. It has FOUR UNREPORTED usages of L1 ("LA - Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario) PERFINS. This has been confirmed by Jon Johnson, keeper of "Canadian Stamps with Perforated Initials". Attached are scans of front, back and enhanced copy of the postmark.

New reports are of 598, 599, 641, 643. The sender was Ontario Development Corporation, dated 24 VII 1979, with "Govt. Mail Service MGS, Toronto Ont." cancels, and registered (\$1.50 registration, 17 cents first ounce).





2006/2 Quarterly Pack

The 2006/2 Quarterly pack (priced at \$14.96) was released in early July. Starting with the 2006 issues, Canada Post announced that they would be including the various souvenir sheets within each each quarterly pack folder. This package has four different souvenir sheets:


- Dorothy Knowles
- Queen Elizabeth II, 80th birthday
- Canadians in Hollywood
- Canadian Forces Snowbirds

They "forgot" to include the Champlain joint-USA souvenir sheet however.

Four self-adhesive stamp issues are die cut to shape — this is becoming practise with most self-adhesive stamps. The four stamps are:

- Birthday Greetings
- McClelland & Stewart Centenary
- Canadian Museum of Civilization
- Vancouver Aquarium

The Canadians in Hollywood set of four self-adhesive stamps is represented simply by tearing apart a full booklet of 8 into two halves.



Meter Replacement Program

Overview

Canada Post and Canadian postage meter suppliers have been working for a number of years to define and develop technology that better meets customer, supplier and postal requirements. The last phase of the meter replacement program will take effect on December 31, 2006, at which date Canada Post will decertify postage meters that are not fully compliant with its new security, digital indicia and product data capture requirements. As of January 1, 2007, meter impressions from decertified meters will not be recognized as valid postage.

To encourage the development and introduction of this new technology and to ensure a smooth transition, the following actions were taken:

- In February 2002, Francotyp-Postalia Canada Inc., Neopost Canada and Pitney Bowes Canada sent a joint letter with Canada Post to current meter customers providing information on the postage meter replacement program, including the changes required and withdrawal dates for then current meter models.
- On March 31, 2003, Canada Post withdrew approval of mechanical postage meters.
- On March 12, 2004, Canada Post withdrew approval of electro-mechanical meters.
- In December 2005, Canada Post sent a letter to current meter customers to remind them, that effective December 31, 2006, Canada Post will decertify all postage meters that are not fully compliant with its new security, digital indicia and usage reporting requirements.

Next Steps

Most of the current digital meter models will require software and/or software and hardware upgrades to become fully compliant while other digital and all electronic models will need to be replaced with a new line of meters. This means that by December 31, 2006, customers must convert to fully compliant digital postage meters.

Francotyp-Postalia, Neopost and Pitney Bowes are developing a complete new product line of digital postage meters that are fully compliant with Canada Post's requirements.

Customers should contact their current postage meter supplier to discuss the status of their current postage meter and discuss availability and features of new postage meter models.

Benefits of Fully Compliant Meters

Data integrity and security are paramount with today's electronic transactions. Canada Post has an obligation to its customers to ensure data integrity and security are key postal requirements.

While technology evolution has exposed some security issues that reveal the importance of data security, fully compliant meters are in keeping with today's technology in mailing solutions and will ensure secure electronic transactions. More convenient and time-efficient, these meters offer intelligent tracking and reporting capabilities, which will provide better service. Evolving to digital technology also presents new possibilities moving forward which translates into added value for mailers.

Adds convenience:

- The internal modem dials out and downloads postage and rates from the EPSS Account
- Self-diagnostic maintenance, fewer moving parts and user maintenance capability minimizes the need for service calls while increasing productivity
- User-friendly, menu-driven, and more powerful
- Ink cartridges have replaced messy ink bottles
- Clear and clean meter impressions and a higher tolerance to envelope imperfections results in a more professional look
- Date changes automatically reducing the chance of returned mail
- Customers can be "top of mind" with their own customers with Canada Post approved promotional slogans on their envelopes through the meter

Saves valuable time with more advanced tracking and reporting:

- Prices are automatically calculated, reducing manual intensive price chart look-up
- Built-in cost expenditure tracking allowing customers to track expenses internally, keeping information such as number of mail items or postage value readily accessible, and providing ability to set up multiple user accounts by meter

Increases security:

- Customers do not have to be concerned about meter tampering with the Postal Security Device (PSD) found in all new meters. The PSD maintains purchased financial values

51¢ Flag Over ...

Stamp placement errors

In the last issue of the Corgi Times (May–June 2006, page 86) we illustrated a pane of the 51¢ Flag Over ... stamps with the centre of column of stamps misplaced resulting in a tete-beche pair placed under another stamp.

I have found the illustration of another booklet exhibiting a similar problem (I knew it was around). This particular booklet has two columns of stamps affected.



Miscut stamps

Miscut stamps on the Flag designs are not common, but they do occur.

Here are some examples that show some significant shifts.

The top pane has the die cutting shifted to the right while the middle image has the die cutting shifted to the left (location of die cutting has been overlayed with a grey line).

The bottom illustration shows the remains of a pane "recovered" from a postal drawer before it was fully used!

The four-sided tagging falls between the stamps. Since only the die cutting has shifted, this results in 3-bar tagged stamps.



Special Envelopes For ORAPEX 2006

Introduction

In keeping with the tradition of the past, two special envelopes were issued for ORAPEX 2006. ORAPEX 2006 was the 45th Exhibition sponsored by the RA Club in Ottawa. The Club paid tribute this year's to C. R. (Ron) McGuire a distinguished Ottawa postal historian, researcher, writer, exhibitor and collector.

ORAPEX 2006 Special Envelopes and Cancellation

Special Envelopes: The special ORAPEX 2006 envelopes pay tribute to C. R. (Ron) McGuire who first distinguished himself as a guest speaker at the RA Stamp Club in 1973. Ron was born in Ottawa in 1943. While in high school Ron worked as an usher, assistant head usher, relief theatre night watchman at the Somerset and later Capitol Theatres and in other part time jobs including service in the militia with the 30th Field Artillery. Ron joined the Bank of Montreal in July 1962 and then moved to the Government of Canada in 1963 where he worked in areas of administration, finance and personnel management at the Canadian Commercial Corporation, the Department of Defence Production, Defence Construction Limited and the Department of External Affairs, before joining the Canada Post Office Department in 1973 where he was the Head, Research and Administration. In May 1982, Ron became the Museum's Senior Postal Historian and with the closure of the museum assumed several other posts. After 1984, he earned a number of diplomas or degrees: a certificate in public administration, diplomas in museum studies, and museum technology, and a bachelor of arts. He has won numerous awards for his contribution to philately and for his best articles.

The special envelopes for ORAPEX 2006 show the picture of Mr. C. R. McGuire on the left. The inscription printed on the right side of the picture reads: "ORAPEX 2006 / May 6-7 mai, 2006 / Ottawa, Canada / C. R. (Ron) McGuire, FRSC / (1943-) / Canadian Military Postal Historian/ Historian de la poste, militaire canadienne".

Two special envelopes were issued for this occasion. The No. 8 American Goldfinch and the No. 10 Scarlet Tanager. These two envelopes were sold at ORAPEX 2006 either mint or cancelled for \$2.50 each. The two covers were sold with two different cancellations one for each cover. If one pays close attention to these covers, the No. 8 and the No. 10 envelopes have different dates at the back of the envelope. Listed below in Table 1 are the statistics on the above covers with different dates that were overprinted which were painstakingly put together by Doug Lingard President of the Organizing Committee for ORAPEX.

So in reality there are seven No. 8 envelopes and seven No. 10 envelopes. Some of these covers can be obtained from Mr. Steve Mulvey.

In addition to the above prints, there were twenty covers printed with the overprint image upside down. These were given as a token for people who were involved in organizing ORAPEX 2006.

Cancellations: This year the show's theme was the 35th Anniversary of the Snowbirds designed by Sara Deschamps. The Snowbirds were introduced to Canada in 1971 and with it came a very highly trained team of world-renowned aerobatics pilots. These pilots have thrilled audiences since the Snowbirds came to Canada with their spectacular performances

every year on Canada Day. One of aerobatics manoeuvres that has always thrilled me is the Russian roulette - i.e., when the planes go in a circle in opposite direction and appear as if they are going to crash into each other as they approach but in the last second they slightly miss colliding.

The cancellation for May 6, 2006 shows "CANADA POST . POSTES CANADA . OTTAWA, ONTARIO" in the outer circle. Inside is a logo of the snowbirds in a hexagon with its name written in two segments of the hexagon at the bottom. Below it is the name 'ORAPEX 2006' highlighted followed by the date '2006-05-06'. The cancellation for May 7 is the same in the outer circle as the above. However, the inside shows nine snowbirds in the form of a rectangle consisting of three snowbirds on each sides. The two cancellations can be seen in the illustration.

Quantity printed: The statistics on the quantity printed were as follows: 300 size #8 and 305 size #10 for 2006 and a breakdown of the total statistics is shown in the table above. The entire set with permutations and combinations consists of the following: one set with one of the two cancellations on the cover (i.e., 28 or 14 envelopes x 2 cancellations); one set with both cancellations on the cover (i.e., 14); and one set with no cancellations on the

cover (i.e., 14) So you will need a total of fifty-six covers. But if you count placement of the two cancels one before the other as different where there are two cancels, then there are seventy different covers in total. Given the printing statistics, it is impossible for any one to have the entire set as in some cases only two or three covers with a particular date were overprinted and each set requires a minimum of four or five.

Concluding Remarks

The proceeds from the sale of these covers goes to support the philatelic activities of the RA Stamp Club in Ottawa. The first ORAPEX was held in 1961 though the RA Stamp Club is known to have hosted its first exhibition as early as the 1950s in the Chateau Laurier. Philatelists are encouraged to buy these covers to support this worthwhile hobby.

ORAPEX 2006 - Four Macdonald Overprints Issued For The Event

Introduction

ORAPEX 2006 sponsored by the R.A. Stamp Club of Ottawa was held on May 6 and May 7, 2006. It was the 45th Exhibition sponsored by this Club in Ottawa. ORAPEX 2006 paid tribute to Ron McGuire a distinguished Ottawa postal historian, researcher, writer, exhibitor and collector. The exhibition consisted of one basic event: stamp exhibits.

ORAPEX 2006 Overprint

The organizers for ORAPEX 2006 overprinted the precancelled 1-cent Sir John A. Macdonald stamp for the 45th Exhibition. Two types of overprints were issued for each day of the exhibition. For May 6: 1) the overprint on the stamps is 'ORAPEX 2006/Ottawa, ON/2006-05-06' in three lines; and 2) The same overprint but printed upside down. For May 7: 1) the overprint on the stamps is 'ORAPEX 2006/Ottawa, ON/2006-05-07' in three lines; and 2) The same overprint but printed upside down. Each overprint was sold for \$2.50.

The Chairman of the ORAPEX committee indicated that the following quantities were overprinted: 1) May 6, normal overprint 100; 2) May 6, inverted overprint 100; 3) May 7, normal overprint 100; and, 4) May 7, inverted overprint 100. The illustrations show these four overprints.

Varieties of Unauthorized Overprints

ORAPEX 2006: It should be pointed out that the varieties described hereafter are based on an examination of a very small sample (6 percent of the total) of the overprints of May 6 and all overprints for May 7 and six percent of the inverted overprints on May 7. Therefore, if one finds other varieties it should not be a surprise to anyone. For the first type of overprint (May 6) for the normally printed overprint there are no noticeable varieties. For the first type of overprint (May 6) for the overprint printed upside down one specific variety was noted: 1) 'ORAPEX 2006' is printed higher and the precancelled lines fall across the 'Ottawa, ON'.

For the second type of overprint (May 7) for the normally printed overprint, the only known variety is: 1) 'Ottawa, ON' is printed touching the second set of precancelled lines found on the lst row of the pane in the first few columns. For the second type of overprint (May 7) for the overprint printed upside down there are no noticeable varieties.

It appears that the organizers are becoming much better in printing the overprints which accounts for the very few varieties.

Concluding Remarks

In sum, ORAPEX 2006 was an interesting philatelic event for Ottawa stamp collectors. There were stamp 41 dealers who participated at the exhibition together with Canada Post. There was the usual stamp auction, the Wine and Cheese party and the awards ceremony at which the awards were given for the exhibits thereafter. It seemed somewhat subdued due to the rainy weather on the first day and one of my friends who accompanied me to the show on the first day indicated that both the exhibits, the number of people attending and Wine and Cheese party were not as good as it was in 2005. Hopefully, it will become better as time passes.
