
Error in Coil Paper Discovered

A major printing error has been discovered on the 63¢ Woodchucks coil of 100 issued December 11, 2013 (Scott 2692).

All stamps *should* include the now-standard repeating ‘Canada’ underprint on the back side of the stamp. This underprint is printed on the back of the stamp (under the gum). It is visible through the self-adhesive backing paper and clearly visible on used copies.



Single stamps, and a full mint roll of 100 stamps found by ESG member Mirko Zátka, have recently surfaced *without* the repeating ‘Canada’ underprint. I have had reports from a few collectors who have found this variety. To repeat, perhaps less than 30 used copies, and the one mint roll of 100 **without the underprint** have so far been found.



It appears as though Lowe-Martin used paper stock that did not have the intended underprint, perhaps due to short notice to print sufficient stock of the denominated 63¢ stamps?

Check your mint and used examples for this *major error*. We welcome hearing of any other reports of this error.

► 2014/02 Quarterly Pack


The second quarterly pack of 2014 was made available in mid-July. It is advertised as having the stamps issued from April through June; it also includes the rate increase definitives released on March 31.

This year’s quarter two pack is the most expensive quarterly pack ever released by Canada Post ... at \$80.87.

► Stuck on Stamps 2014 # 2

The second *Stuck on Stamps* package for 2014, advertised as “For Kids”, also became available in mid July. These packages contain mint copies of newly released stamps along with ‘collecting’ cards containing information about each included stamp.

This is the eighth such *Stuck on Stamps* pack that Canada Post has released (they started in 2012).



Cost of Collecting

With the latest quarterly pack released by Canada Post (see previous page) having a cost of just over \$80 for the many different stamps included in just the one pack, I began to think of another way of comparing the cost of collecting new issues from Canada Post.

The accompanying graph shows the costs of the January–June quarterly packs from 1990 to 2014. The dollar values are the face value of the stamps included in the Jan–Mar and Apr–Jun quarterly packs for the respective years. In other words, the stamps issued in only the first six months of each year.



These costs do *not* include stationery (postal cards, envelopes), commemorative envelopes, thematic collections, first day covers, uncut press sheets, philatelic/numismatic products, full booklet panes and coils. For many collectors, some or all of these items are also purchased on a regular basis.

A casual glance at the chart shows that from 1990 through about 2003, the approximate average cost for six months of stamps was around \$20. This rises dramatically in the last 10 years until the \$98.98 price for six months of stamps in this year alone.

True, part of this cost is the rise in postal rates, particularly the significant increase in rates effective just a couple of months ago (March 31, 2014) when the domestic/US/international rates rose from 63¢/\$1.10/\$1.85 to 85¢/\$1.20/\$2.50 respectively.

However, a larger part of the dramatic increase in the cost of collecting must also be attributed to the significant increase in the number of different stamps being issued. This includes both the number of stamp topics, the number of stamps per issue, and the various formats being issued (self-adhesive booklet and coils, and water-activated gum souvenir sheets).

I suspect that many collectors of 'modern' material have given serious thought to stop buying new issues, both because of the higher cost and the exorbitant number of non-historical stamp issues being released. I am certainly one of those.

Imperforate Gutters

The 2014/02 Quarterly Pack includes three more *imperforate* gutter varieties. The first example seen was the Superman strip from the 2013/03 Quarterly Pack, as discussed and illustrated in the November–December 2013 *Corgi Times* (page 42).

These four varieties are created when a vertical (or horizontal) strip of all stamp designs is die cut to shape. The self-adhesive booklets of 10 contain two such strips of stamps that span the rouletted, folder gutter separating the different parts of the complete booklet. For the quarterly packs, the gutter is not rouletted, as it is for the complete folded booklet distributed to post office outlets.

The result are unique collectable varieties found only in the quarterly packs. The three new strips are illustrated below.

We continue illustrating some of the constant cylinder varieties found on the 14¢ and 17¢ Queen Elizabeth II booklets of 27 (Part 1 is found in the May–June 2014 *Corgi Times*).

The flaws shown here are common to the red/green cylinder, which is shared between the two denominations. (Not all flaws are illustrated, either due to their small size or lack of having a corresponding pane to scan).

A Constant Variety on the 1971 Maple Leaves in Winter

A variety, which has not previously been reported, can be found on panes of the 1971 Maple Leaves in Winter issue (Scott 538), at position 49. This “snow bug” variety takes the form of a cluster of grey dots in the snow just above and to the left of the leaf end of the petiole.

This variety occurs on all panes, both inscripted and field stock, which I have examined. In addition, all first day covers produced by Canada Post and bearing a lower right plate block show the variety. Also, I have found the variety on at least one per hundred used stamps I have looked at. Ideally this rate should be one per fifty if it is constant for all panes on the press sheet. However, in some cases the variety will be obscured by the cancellation.

Three panes were inspected at the Canadian Postal Archives: an early plate proof (1989-565.000538-038), a later plate proof (1989-565.000538-040), and an inscripted pane (1989-565.000538-041). The variety was found on the later proof and the inscripted pane but not on the early proof.





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
