## Wilding Error Discovered

An imperforate between error on the 2¢ Wilding miniature pane of 25 has recently been reported, some 63 years after the stamps were issued.

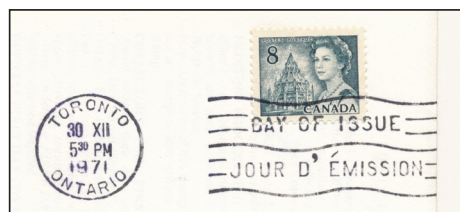
The 2¢ Wilding cello paq (illustrated at right) contains two panes of 25 stamps.

The error is a block of 10 stamps which are imperforate horizontally between the two rows. The block consists of the two bottom rows of the pane.

The VGG certification of authenticity is illustrated below. The person who passed along this information said the following: "These stamps were purchased in Moncton, N.B. and have been in my possession for over 55 years."

Here is what Canada Post is up to these days...

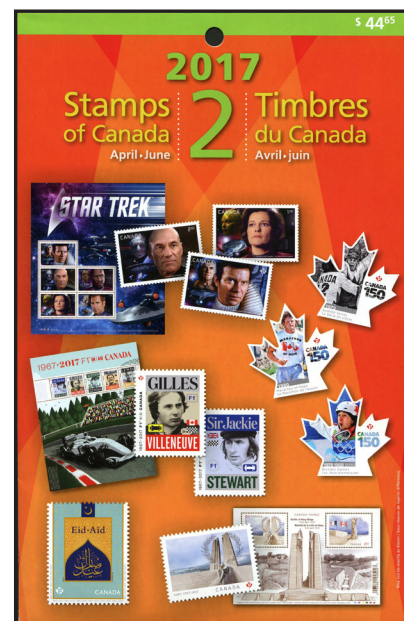
### ► 2017/2 Quarterly Pack

The April–June 2017 quarterly pack of stamps became available at the end of June. At \$44.65 it is the fourth most expensive quarterly pack Canada Post has sold ... and it is **not** complete with examples of all of the stamps issued in those three months.

Missing are examples of the souvenir sheets from the Star Trek™ Prestige booklet. If these were included, the price of the pack would increase by \$22.25 to \$66.90 (which would make it the second most expensive quarterly pack).

Five issues are represented in this pack:

- Battle of Vimy Ridge
- Star Trek™: Year 2
- Formula 1 Grand Prix du Canada
- Eid
- Canada 150



As we have noted in previous *Corgi Times*, the Vimy Ridge and Eid stamps come with *multiple* die cut varieties. ESG members have asked if *all* 7 different Vimy Ridge and 3 different Eid varieties will appear in the quarterly pack. Here are the singles that my pack had ... please forward a 600dpi scan of the front and back of your examples ... we will report the group's findings in a future *Corgi Times*.

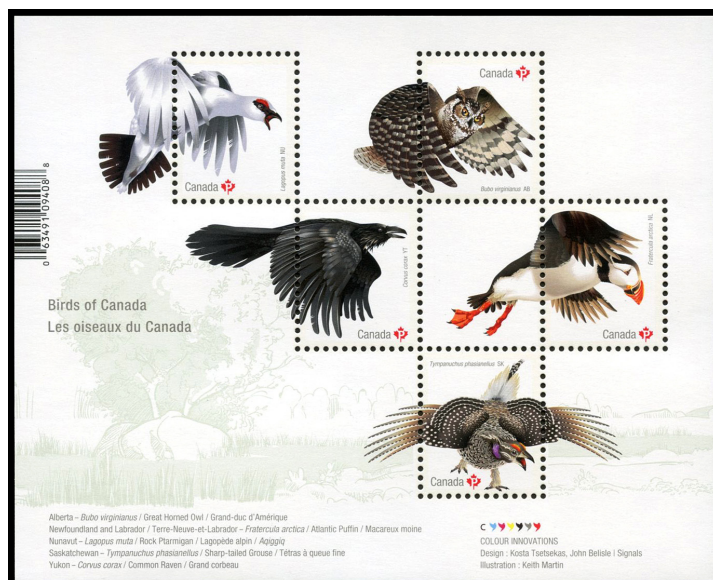

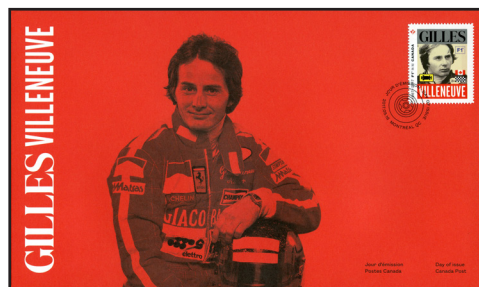


## Villeneuve OFDC Recall

As we reported in the last *Corgi Times*, Canada Post has recalled the Gilles Villeneuve OFDC, one of five in a set of stamps issued May 16 to honour Formula 1 Grand Prix Du Canada winners

This recall affected the single Villeneuve OFDC, the set of five OFDC pack, and the Villeneuve framed print (which includes an OFDC).

The corrected version, available in late June, has a subtle change in the English and French wording of Villeneuve's birthplace (changed to 'home province'). Here is the original/recall text (top), and corrected/revised text (the UPC barcode was also changed):

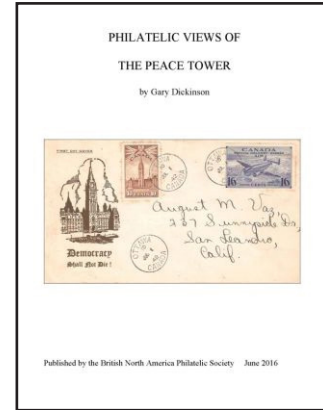

The Peace Tower in the Centre Block of Ottawa's Parliament Buildings is one of Canada's four best known national symbols, along with the Maple Leaf, the Beaver and the distinctive red and white flag. In his latest BNAPS handbook, *Philatelic Views of the Peace Tower*, Gary Dickinson describes and analyzes the various uses that have been made of the Peace Tower image on philatelic material, with particular attention to its appearances on first day covers (FDCs) over the years. The Peace Tower has been featured on at least 16 stamp designs issued by the Canada Post Office. In some cases it appears as part of an overall view of Parliament Hill, while in others it is either the primary focus of the design or a portion is shown. The earliest stamp showing the Peace Tower was the 3¢ denomination of the 60th Anniversary of Confederation issue in 1927. The Tower has also been featured in first flight cachets, on the covers of stamp booklets, in first day cancellations and, of course, on a great number of first day covers.

# Toronto "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation on 8-cent Queen Elizabeth II and Library of Parliament Definitive Issue

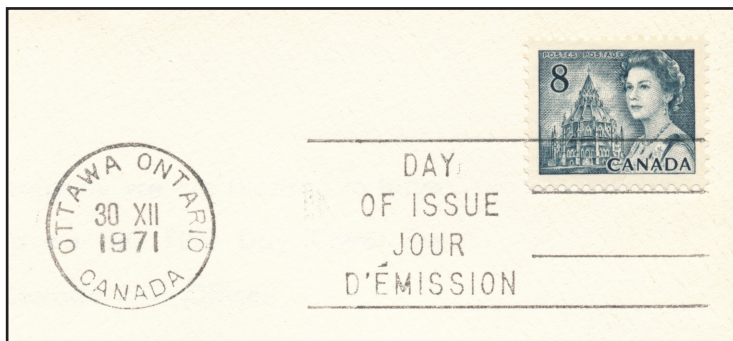


Figure 1: The normal – Ottawa/Ontario/Canada straight-line bilingual "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation.

On December 30, 1971, the Canada Post Office issued an 8-cent definitive depicting Queen Elizabeth II and the Library of Parliament. The day of issue site was Ottawa, Ontario. Figure 1 illustrates the Ottawa "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation to service first day covers.

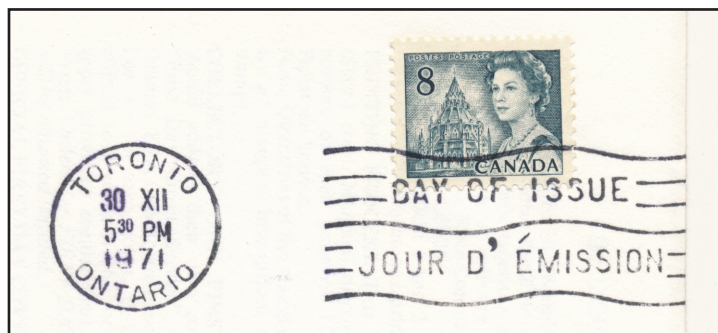


Figure 2: The unusual – Toronto/Ontario wavy seven-line bilingual "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation.

On the same day, reason unknown, Postal Station "A" in Toronto, Ontario, offered to service first day covers with a wavy seven-line bilingual "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation (Figure 2). Interestingly, this cancellation officially serviced first day covers at Ottawa from October 2, 1958 to October 12, 1966.

Figures 3 to 6 illustrates my collection of the unusual Toronto first day cover service. Not illustrated is a Winnipeg Tagged single similar to Figure 5.

This is the only issue known on first day covers with the Toronto/Ontario wavy seven-line bilingual "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation.

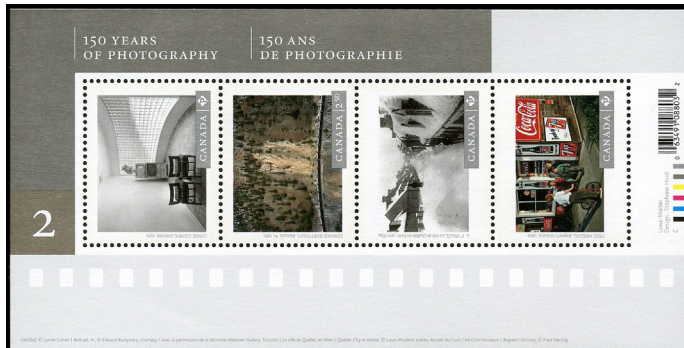


Figure 6: Untagged 25-cent booklet pane of the 8-cent Library of Parliament on a Rosecraft cachet with the Toronto "DAY OF ISSUE" cancellation.

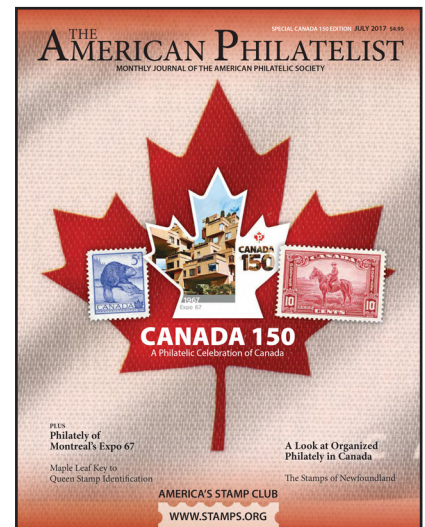
## Canada 150 – *The American Philatelist*

In July of 1967, Canada celebrated its 100th birthday and I celebrated my 16th. I have long ago lost most memories of my birthday party but not of Canada's. Part of that Canada-wide centennial celebration would be the staging of the 1967 World's Fair in my hometown. It promised to be something that I would long remember. Fifty years later, the memories are still vivid. What follows is a remembrance of that unique period in Montreal and Canada's history. Through the stamps that were issued by participating and non-participating countries, I hope to awaken the memories of those who were able to visit the fair. For those who have only a passing acquaintance, to give a glimpse of the enthusiasm of Canada in that centennial year.

Montreal was not the first choice for the World's Fair of 1967. That honor was to go to the USSR in recognition of the 50th anniversary of the Communist Revolution of 1917. However, Russia cited cost constraints as a reason for dropping out, although a like-

by factor was the Soviet Union's fear of ideological contamination by all those foreign visitors to the fair. The mayor of Montreal, Jean Drapeau, was quick to resuscitate the Canadian bid. He championed the choice of islands in the St. Lawrence River (Figure 1) over other proposed sites. As it turned out, it was an inspired idea and one of the more important factors contributing to the success of Expo.

Drapeau chose as the theme of Expo 67, "Terre des Hommes," translated as "Man and His World," and was borrowed from French author Antoine de Saint-Exupéry. It encapsulated the concept of man and his ideological, cultural, and scientific relationship to his environment.

Another proposed unique feature was passports, which were to be used as daily, weekly, or seasonal tickets for entry to the site. The passport was a booklet with your photograph (season only) and blank pages for visa stamps from the various pavilions. The cover featured the Expo 67 emblem, an

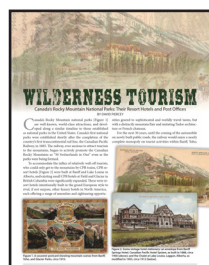
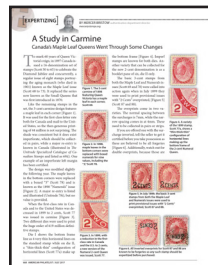
**A TRIBUTE TO DIVERSE WILDLIFE STAMPS**  
First-Day Covers Accompanied 1950s Series Showing Common and Endangered Animals

Four of the first 15 Scott Canada catalog numbers are for stamps featuring a beaver. Between 1859 and 1953, kings, queens, and occasional scenic views dominated Canada's postage stamps. Canada geese appeared on airmail stamps in 1946 and 1952, but it was not until 1953 that the Post Office Department launched a series of 11 mostly low-denomination stamps that brought the country's wildlife into prominence.

The impetus for this development came from two principal sources. First came the highly regarded work of Jack Miner, who some have called "the father of North American conservationism." He was born in Ohio in 1865 but moved to Kingsville, Ontario in 1878. His homestead became a bird sanctuary in the early 20th century and he was one of the first people to trap and band wild ducks and geese. He lectured and wrote extensively about wildlife conservation beginning in 1910 and continued to do so until his death in 1944.

The second impetus for the wildlife series of stamps came when the Parliament of Canada passed the National Wildlife Week Act in 1947. This event was to take place every year to honor Miner's conservation work, and it was scheduled for the week in which April 10 occurred, as this marked the anniversary of his birth.

The 11 stamps honoring Canada's wildlife were produced over a five-year period beginning in 1953. All of them were issued in early April at the rate of three per year for the first two





# The Final 1969 Issue of Postal Scrip Stamps

This short article is a show and tell of the final 1969 issue of Postal Scrip stamps. Printed by lithography, the eighteen denominations featured the new modular 24 mm by 20 mm size similar to the 6¢ orange Queen Elizabeth II and Transportation definitive of 1968.

Illustrated is the final 1969 issue of eighteen denominations applied over nine sequentially numbered Canadian Postal Money Orders issued at Sub 40 in Hamilton, Ontario on October 15, 1970 – the last day of sale of Postal Scrip stamps.

A new postal money order system and Canadian Postal Money Order form was introduced on the next day, October 16, 1970 ending the need for Postal Scrip stamps.

Illustrated on the next 3 pages:

- a: 10¢ black + 1¢ brown (top), 20¢ green + 2¢ green (middle), 30¢ blue + 3¢ violet (bottom).
- b: 40¢ olive + 4¢ rose (top), 50¢ brown + 5¢ blue (middle), 60¢ yellow + 6¢ olive (bottom).
- c: 70¢ red + 7¢ orange (top), 80¢ green + 8¢ blue (middle), 90¢ brown + 9¢ lilac (bottom).
