

Canada Post News

Here is what Canada Post is up to these days...

► 2021/1 Quarterly Pack

The first quarterly pack of 2021 appeared in the middle of March. It is advertised as having the stamps issued from January through March.

The price of this year's Quarter 1 pack is a bit less than in previous years, due mostly to the lack of a postal rate increase ... but it is still a moderate \$38.64.

There are only four stamp issues included:

- The Lunar New Year Cycle
- Black History
- Snow Mammals
- Crabapple Blossoms

On-line ordering of this quarterly pack was limited to just one per order.

Perhaps because of the popularity of the Lunar New Year Cycle 'special' pane of 12?

The booklet pane of 12 of The Lunar New Year Cycle issue is *unfolded*. The panes issued through post office outlets and via mail/on-line ordering were folded.

This was not the first time that unfolded examples of previously issued folded panes have appeared in the semi-annual/quarterly packs/annual collection:

- Comic Book Superheroes pane (Oct 2/95)
- Fresh Waters of Canada (May 23/00)
- Tourist Attractions (May 11/01)
- Tourist Attractions (Jun 1/02)
- Tourist Attractions (Jun 12/03)

The Elizabethan II Study Group will be holding a virtual Zoom meeting. Mark your calendars!



2020 Geldert Medal Awarded to Robin Harris

Robin Harris — our editor and prolific writer — is the recipient of the 2020 Geldert Medal. This honour, which may be awarded annually by The Royal Philatelic Society of Canada, recognizes the best article published in *The Canadian Philatelist*. Robin's article on "Becoming the Understudy: Canada's Repeating 'Canada' Underprint" appeared in the March/April 2020 issue. As noted in The RPSC's March 2021 Newsletter, "the article contained excellent original research on modern Canadian issues that helps analyze new printing techniques to allow a better understanding and classification of varieties, an important area of modern Canadian philately." The Geldert Committee of The RPSC "also considered that the article was well laid out and well-illustrated to aid the reader." Congratulations, Robin!

ESG and CAPEX 2022



Snow Mammals: Die Cut Variety

February 16 saw the release of five stamps depicting Snow Mammals. These proved to be very popular with the public as seen by Canada Post printing an additional quantity.

The Jan–Mar 2021 Quarterly Pack contained the usual die cut to shape singles of each stamp.

One of the die cut single stamps — Snowshoe hare — does not match up with the issued booklet. This single (and perhaps the others?) must have been printed and die cut in a *different* location on the press sheet for the sole purpose of inclusion in the quarterly pack. This practice has also been seen on the 2004 Christmas stamps (see *Corgi Times*, Jan–Feb 2005, page 53) and the Permanent™ (51¢) Flag over Scenery definitives of 2006 (see *Corgi Times*, May–Jun 2016, pages 95–97).



Illustrated below are the five die cut singles along with an image of the unfolded booklet cover. Notice that the single design, outlined in red, does not match up with any location on the booklet cover.

For wild animals, effective camouflage can mean the difference between life and death. Blending into the landscape makes it easier for prey to hide and predators to hunt. Some mammals, including the five featured on these stamps, have coats that moult to white in winter and back to brown or grey in spring. This process, triggered by changes in daylight hours, increases their odds of survival throughout the year.

Pour les animaux sauvages, un camouflage efficace est une question de vie ou de mort. Dissimulés dans le paysage, proies et prédateurs passent plus facilement inaperçus. Certains animaux, dont les cinq mammifères présentés sur ces timbres, voient leur pelage blanchir en hiver, puis revenir au brun ou au gris au printemps. Déclenché par les variations dans la durée du jour, ce processus augmente leurs chances de survie tout au long de l'année.






Earle Covert's *Canadian Postal Stationery Using the Karsh and Wilding Photography of Queen Elizabeth II* and *The Cameo and Centennial Postal Stationery of Canada* are the 108th and 109th volumes in the BNAPS Exhibit Book Series.

The two books are the second and third BNAPS exhibit books to be published in 11" × 17" folded ledger paper landscape format.

Earle Covert's many years of research and collecting have resulted in major collections of Queen Elizabeth II era Karsh, Wilding, Cameo and Centennial Postal Stationery that are unrivalled.

Earle Covert was born in Toronto in 1938. He attended schools in Brooklyn, New York, Toronto and Ottawa. In 1964, after graduating as a Medical Doctor from Queens University in Kingston, Ontario, he and his late wife Audrey moved to Hay River, Northwest Territories, where he started General Practice. In the 32 years he was there, he also did obstetrics, minor surgery, anesthesia and occasionally dentistry, and served as Coroner, Town Councillor, and Medical Officer of Health. With other physicians, he provided service to Fort Providence, Fort Resolution and Pine Point, travelling thousands of miles by small aircraft and car. In 1996, Earle and Audrey moved to Alberta. Earle continued to practice part-time in Hay River and Fort Simpson, and then at the Campbell Clinic in Coaldale, before retiring in December 2012.

Earle has been involved in BNAPS as Secretary, Member of the Board, Chairman of the Board and President, and is currently Chairman of the Convention Committee and Chairman of the Postal Stationery Study Group. He has shown over 60 different exhibits of Canadian postal stationery, revenues, and modern postal history. He published *Strike Courier and Local Post of the Elizabethan Era*, and wrote over 20 articles for *BNA Topics* and for *Postal Stationery*, the journal of the United Postal Stationery Society.

Year of the Rooster Transitional Souvenir Sheet

Home Front

I may have missed my annual look at a Canadian stamp last year based on the 'hours' that appear on my John Deere Utility tractor. Illustrated is a picture of what appeared a few days ago on the tractor while doing yard work. One can see "Scott numbers" just about anywhere and then reminisce about a past stamp issue.



The 39¢ stamp, Canada Scott 1298, is from the Second World War, 1940, Canada Mobilizes Its Resources stamp issue. Four stamps were released on November 9, 1990. This particular one is *Home Front*.

From Canada Post's product announcement:

This set of four commemorative stamps is the second in a series marking the 50th anniversary of Canada's contribution to the Allied war effort during the Second World War. Canada Post Corporation recognizes the hardships endured by Canadian individuals and families who remained on the Home Front. The many communal activities, organizations and programs that were created boosted morale and provided assistance to troops, prisoners of war and their families. Canada's important contribution in food production helped feed the Allied nations. And through research, inventions and innovations, Canadian scientists and medical doctors made significant technological developments, which helped to win the war. Pierre-Yves Pelletier designed these stamps with the help of illustrations by fellow Montrealer, Jean-Pierre Armanville. The stamps depict realistic scenes, focusing on the effects of war on people.
