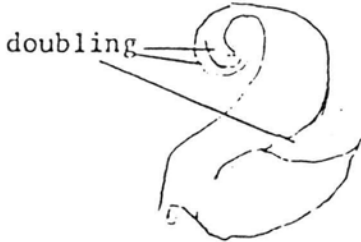

date not legible

Shade: Reddish Brown

1.  2 'sets' of constant dots or scratches in 'A' of Canada
2.  4 or 5 constant dots in left side of 'O' of postage
3. A heavy dot above in margin between 'O' and 'S' of postage
4. Dot in upper right margin

perf: 12 x 12 med. wove

paper: horizontal

The Broken T Variety



Two copies: one mint
one used

Shade: Reddish Brown



The left wing of the 'T' is lifted upwards

it is not altered in size

Perf: 12 x 12



Paper: Thin in used copy
Med. wove in mint
Queen is thick, yellowish

No position dots



Two copies, both used, one Montreal cancel

Shade: Reddish Brown

1.  Five or six constant dots in 'N' of Canada
2.  A constant dot above the 'split' in the base of the 'T' of postage
3. A dot below 'S' of postage
4. In the off center copy there is a hairline on the right side.

Perf: 12 x 12

Paper: horizontal, med. wove

Position: One copy is badly centered and has the imprint the whole length at the top

The questions that this stamp poses are:

1. Is it related to the 5¢ Re-entry on the 6¢ S.Q. as per Allison's article BNA topics page 69?
2. Why should there be a pair of letters in Canada Postage involved?
3. The same applies to the constant dot variety in A & O.
4. Perhaps these are 'new' questions that have already been answered. I'm checking on further references so that our knowledge can be furthered.
