The Dead Letter Office of St John's Newfoundland

In this presentation, he will explore the Dead Letter Office (DLO) in St. John's, Newfoundland, discussing its operations, markings, and significance. By showcasing key items from his collection and elements of his original research, Blair aims to provide new insights into this overlooked aspect of postal history. This talk serves as a foundation for his upcoming single-frame exhibit, and he welcomes feedback to help refine the final exhibit.

Ed.- Marcophily, occasionally called Marcophilately, is the specialised study and collection of postmarks, cancellations and postal markings applied by hand or machine on mail that passes through a postal system and applied by the postal operator through whose domain they pass.

SOME RESPONSES FROM SGN 26



From Klaus Wehlt: In response to the Charles Foster item in SGN26, according to Paul Binney's list, the Sherbrooke Fusilier Regiment used the Military Censor No.2 together with CAPO No. 1 from September 1941 to December 1941. I may have received this list directly from Paul, I no longer know. That would match to Charles' cover.

I have a (small) collection of censored mail covers from Newfoundland from the period of the 2nd World War. Both CAPO covers and civil censor mail. I am always in contact with Paul Binney about the CAPO covers and the Military Censor Postmarks.



From Blair Ashford: In response to Klaus Whelt in SGN 26, I also saw this cover on eBay, and was going to bid on it. As a collector of Newfoundland postage due, and registered covers, this cover was attractive to me. Like you, I also like the Humphrey Gilbert issue, and agree that they are uncommon on cover.

As you have noted, the cover pays the correct rate for inland registered mail (4¢ inland rate + 5¢ registration). The rate to Canada would have been 15¢ (5¢ preferential

foreign rate + 10¢ foreign registration). So, if the letter was to have been mailed to Canada, it would be 6¢ short, incurring a double fee of 12¢, as noted on the cover.

With no additional registration markings, which should occur when a registered cover transits multiple cities and countries, and no additional postage due markings, I suspect that this cover went direct to Gaultois, so the 9¢ stamp was sufficient. Like you, I smell a philatelic cover, that probably was not entertained by the post office.

From Steve Bonowski: A First Flight Cover Newfoundland, St. Pierre & Miquelon, New York

I am not sure when I actually bought the cover, or from whom. I'm thinking maybe in 2022.

It caught my eye for a couple reasons. One is that it's a first flight cover. Second is the bi-national (if that's a correct word) franking. Those are hard to find. I have seen a few examples of letters going from northern Angola to Leopoldville in the Belgian Congo and then onto Europe. Those have bi-national franking. In recent years, I've bought a lot of Portuguese colonial covers to complement my extensive collections of the colonies. But no double frankings (yet).

From Rick Baxter: NEWFOUNDLAND POST TO ENGLAND & USA



St John's NL to Highfield, Southampton, England, franked 1¢ to 24¢ Trail of the Caribou stamps, CDS cancel St. John's Feb. 26, 1919. The envelope does not appear to have been attached to a package therefore there is no obvious explanation for the 90¢ postage paid other than it is philatelic in nature. The recipient is believed to be Sir Sydney Guy Kimber a local politician in Highfield and knighted in 1935. It is assumed the stamps and letter were for the recipient's collection.

I have been in contact with a member of the Southampton and District Philatelic Society (SDPS). The great nephew of Gordon Thorne indicated Mr. Thorne was a founding member of the SDPS was also a friend & associate of Sir Sidney Guy Kimber. Both individuals were instrumental in the building of the Southampton Civic Centre and may have shared philatelic interests. The Gordon Thorne Trophy is awarded to the club member with the best overall winning entry from either the sixteen or thirty-two sheet club competitions.



Sandy Point NL to Boston MA franked with 36¢ Trail of the Caribou stamp on piece: Split ring cancel Sandy Point, Feb. 20, 1926. Red hand-stamp: "US Customs Passed Free, Boston Mass". Believed to have originated from Rev. E.A Butler, located at Sandy Point NL, a well know stamp dealer in NL until the 1940s. Rev. Butler had many clients in the USA.
