THE MISSING "THREE" VARIETY OF 1920

POSTSCRIPT

I have been expanding my research, have learned a lot more, but since believe there is no completely missing "THREE" on the 1920 3¢ on 35¢ provisional. My original article appeared in NEWFIE NEWSLETTER #55. The block of 25 pictured on Page 7 was sold in 1992 by Ed Wener of INDIGO. It tells the true story, I believe with three major varieties, the THREE (almost) missing in position #18, with a rough line at bottom showing, the THREE showing only a line at the top in #19, and the NTS of CENTS cut at the top in #20. The pair pictured here has #20 at the top. I have seen copies of all these varieties, but none with the THREE completely absent. I plan to submit an illustrated article in a future BNA TOPICS on this.



Many thanks for my issue of the latest Newfie Newsletter. Unfortunately, pages 3/4 have been omitted from my copy and I am hoping that you can send them on to me.

I note your comments about contributions to the Newsletter and am wondering if the following enquiry is appropriate to incorporate in a future issue.

You will note from the enclosed Xerox that it refers to the lc codfish stamp of the 1932 Resources Issue in green.

The pair on the left is the imperforate between (horizontal) vertical pair which is referenced as: S.G. 209ba; Unitrade 183i and Newfoundland Specialized 176d.

The copy on the right is of course an imperforate horizontal vertical pair with side sheet margin. This item is not referenced by either Gibbons or Unitrade but does bear a relationship to that listed in your catalogue as 176d.

In view of the generous margins both top and bottom on the latter pair I seek information in respect of the sheet format from whence this item originated. Could it have been prepared specifically as a booklet sheet and received just the vertical perforation. Incidentally, the vertical perforation on both items is 13.2.

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




