Dear Sir,

At the suggestion of a fellow member of the Perth Philatelic Society, Mr Jim McLaren, I am writing to enquire about Newfoundland covers.

I have a thematic collection entitled Radio and Telegraphy on Stamps, which includes a section on The Submarine Cable. As I am sure you know, Newfoundland is the landing place for several Trans Atlantic cables, first to Hearts Content in 1858 then Trinity Bay 1866 (with the same landing place I presume) and later to Clarenville in 1956 and to Hampden. Cape Ray to Cape Breton in 1855 and Corner Brook to Grosses Roches (not on my map) in 1961 were (are) Canada mainland links. I wonder if any covers exist with these place names on the cancellation. For the early cables, mail cancelled pre 1900 would be better- i.e. the Victoria era. I have a nice cover for that date from Valencia Island, from where the cables left Ireland to cross the Atlantic.

On the west coast, the Pacific cable was laid from somewhere in the Vancouver area in circa 1902 to Fanning Island and later telephone cables (COMPAC) also left from that location.

I would be pleased to know if any covers exist with the appropriate place names with or without a direct reference to the cable stations.

Sorry I only have US dollars but hope they help to cover any response that you can send me.


