This list has the first post person where possible - to show authenticity, the opening and closing dates to 1998 * and the population at its peak. I am waiting for copies of the Canadian Post Office Credit Book Reports to find the post person and latest dates 1949-1998.

BNAPS NEWFOUNDLAND STUDY GROUP ANNUAL MEETING ORLANDO, FLORIDA, OCTOBER 30, 1998

J. Don Wilson acted as chair and recording secretary. 7 members were present for part or all of the meeting. Financial report to September 30, 1998, was presented and approved. John Butt, president and Martin Goebel, treasurer were re-elected by acclamation. Special vote of appreciation was given to Newsletter editor, John Butt, for his dedication and hard work in providing six Newsletters each year over the last number of years and appreciation that he agreed to carry on with this project.

The chair explained to the group that the Atlantic Province had acquired 120 new exhibit frames, 240 faces, at a cost of \$33,000 and asked for a donation of \$1,000 CDN. from the Study Group. After discussion the proposal was accepted. Some members were disappointed they could not exhibit at BNAPEX '97 due to lack of frames. At that time there was only 80 frames available. A round table discussion on Newfoundland material etc. Before we knew it, our one hour time slot was gone. As a side note, the frames are held in trust for use in the Atlantic Province Stamp Club by Atlantic Exhibition Frame Society, 1070 Bland Street, Halifax, Nova Scotia, B3H 2S8 (phone: 4020423-7687). The Society's Chair is Dr. J. J. MacDonald with Dr. Graham McCleave (Fredericton, NB) and J. Don Wilson (St. John's, NF) as Directors. The Board of BNAPS and RPSC also gave an additional donation of \$2,000 CDN toward the cost of 40 additional new frames.

Perfins on Stamps of Newfoundland

On March 26, 1995 an article was published in The BNA Perforator (Vol 16, Number 1- Whole Number 92) which presented the results of a survey begun some 10 years earlier. This survey, completed by Russ Deveau, listed all known perfin patterns on stamps of Nfld. These were listed by pattern, issue and position of the perfin. Two additional updates boosted the number of known perfins to some 500+. Until recently this information was taken for granted and no questions were raised as to its accuracy.

Anyone collecting Nfld stamps will surely understand the problem of identifying some of the issues which were issued with different perforations, new dies or watermarked vs unwatermarked papers. I know that some of the original information was erroneous and with this article I hope to begin a process to correct these problems and issue an accurate update. Part of the problem with the original survey was that it sat unattended for about ten years. After such a long interval is was impossible to contact some of the original respondents for obvious reasons and corrections / confirmations could not be done. My intent is to undertake a new survey of all known perfins on stamps of Nfld. including documents, covers etc. I am asking that all collectors with Nfld perfin material please send me a list of your holdings with the stamps identified by pattern, issue and perfin position as well as how many of each item you have. To help with some of the harder items I am including a check list to help differentiate one issue from another. The original survey had a total of 113 respondants from Canada the United States and Great Britain. With this in mind I am sending this article to the BNAPS Perfin Study Group, The Perfins Club in the United States and the Great Britain Perfin Society, as well as the BNAPS Newfoundland study group. If you know of anyone who collects this area and is not a member of one of the above groups please invite them to respond as well. The more people involved the more accurate the survey will be.

The following table lists stamps which have the same pattern (picture), but were issued with two different perforations. The first column lists the original Scott (Unitrade) number (perf 13.5), and the second colomn lists the second issue (perf 12.5).

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The other area with major difficulty in identification is the three series of the Publicity Issue. Perforations are not a concern here since all three sets were issued in a multitude of perforations. There are however some major differences in the three sets. The first issue, in 1928, was printed by Whitehead, Morris & Co but in 1929 Messrs. John Dickinson & Co, through Perkins Bacon & Co, used re-engraved dies for the second printing. This on unwatermarked paper. The third issue, using the re-engraved dies, was printed on watermarked paper. The major differences in the dies are summarised below.


