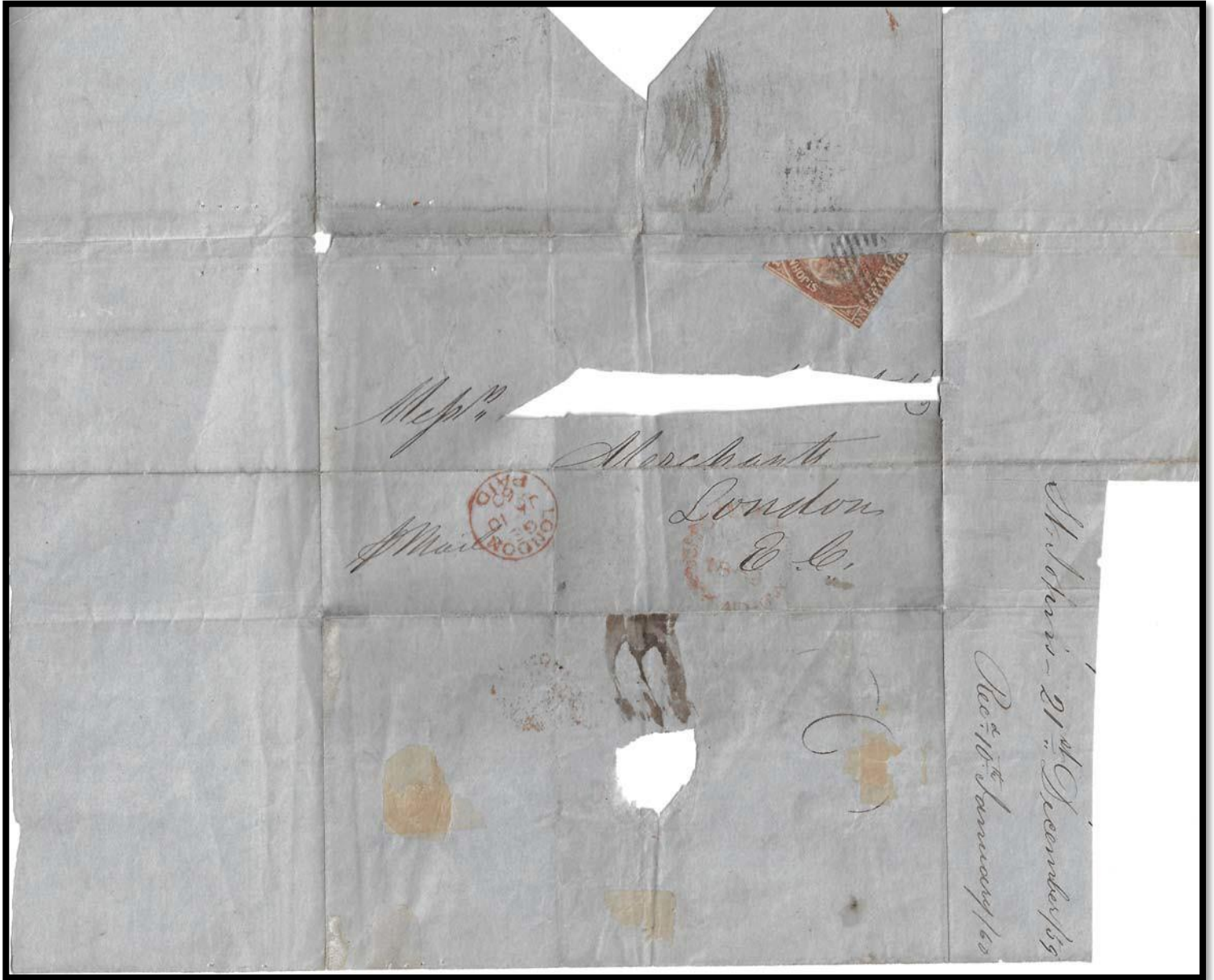

NEWFOUNDLAND: An Amazing 1859 Bisected Shilling Letter Find

This letter with a bisected shilling was listed in an auction catalogue and I was given the opportunity to study it. This chance to do an authenticity determination of its 'bisected' stamp status presented a great research opportunity.

This cover presents as a folded manuscript letter dated 21st December 59 and with a Rec'd 10th January 60. There is a red St. John's Newfoundland circular dated 1859 cancel with a receiver red London Ja 10 60 PAID cancel.

The most important observation is that when this stamp was bisected, the presented diagonal cut enabled the full stamp design to be measured in both the vertical and horizontal directions, most fortuitous. The use of measurements provides a better method of identification. It is not subjective to eye colour cones that differ with each individual.

I have provided in the same scan with this bisected shilling stamp a millimetre (mm) ruler. This will enable the reader to do their own measurements. The determined and published measurements for the shilling stamps as issued for Newfoundland's three issues can be found in MAPLE LEAVES Vol. 38 No. 2 April 2023 Whole No. 368., the Journal of The Canadian Philatelic Society of Great Britain and in *Walsh 2025 Newfoundland Specialized Stamp Catalogue*.

The shilling stamp millimetre (mm) measurements are: shilling stamp of width x height mm

1s scarlet 1857 19.5 x 25.25

1s orange 1860 19.5 x 25

1s rose lake 1861 19.0 x 25

The 19.5 x 25.25 mm measurement was determined for this bisect; it is larger than 25 and smaller than 25.5 mm.

The stamp is engraved. To my eyes the image ink colour is of a scarlet vermilion, not an orange colour. Observation of this cancel shows that the bisected stamp side is tied to the envelope.

The 10 bar cancel, as provided on an acetate sheet by Pratt in his book *The Pence Issues of Newfoundland 1857-1866*, matches when it is overlaid onto this envelope's cancel. Even the cancel has a dull muddy black colour. It is similar to Pratt's description of cancels from this time period. The multi-bar measurements between different sets of 3 bars are consistent with *Walsh 2025 Newfoundland Specialized Stamp Catalogue* observed 4 mm. spacing, or the Pratt 4.5 mm setting.

The cancel has a genuine 10 bar design which is consistent with this time period.

Quantities as provided by Pratt for the first issued shilling imaged stamps are 2000 with the colour being scarlet vermilion and were ordered for January 1857. Pratt provides that a further 1000 were ordered for the second issue in August 1860. The colour for this second order is observed as being somewhat different, and in the orange colour. As shown, this envelope with bisect stamp is dated well before August 1860. In August 1854 the postal rate for a single folder letter to Great Britain was 6d. It seems that the 5000 quantity of 6d stamps ordered between 3 September 1855 and 7 February 1856 were being used up faster than anticipated. However, by bisecting a shilling this 6d postal rate would be satisfied. Pratt writes on page 28 that bisected stamp use started in the fall of 1859. It began with the bisecting of the 8d stamps occurring in October and that the bisecting of the shilling stamp started in November 1859. This letter under study certainly falls into the proper timeline.

Pratt on page 88 states that there are at least 18 covers with the bisected shilling paying of the 6d postage rate, while on page 145 it is stated there are 14 halved shilling scarlet vermilion bisected stamped covers. On page 151 is a table listing the known pence covers. There it is listed that 14 bisected scarlet vermilion, 2 bisected orange and 4 bisected rose coloured shilling covers exist. The individually named bisected scarlet vermilion cover list is positioned on page 171.

Most are shown posted to London Great Britain starting with a dated cover from 8 January 1860. From the in-depth study conducted by Pratt when writing his book he does not list bisected shilling covers dated in 1859. It would seem that this December 1859 bisected scarlet vermilion cover was never observed during his research. To my knowledge it is the first known bisected shilling scarlet vermilion dated in 1859. A fantastic cover.

In the most recent Newfoundland Newsletter (NN198), I read the new report by Andrew Hussey, of a previously unreported Newfoundland Assorting Office postmark.

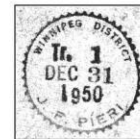
