

## **The Last Canadian Perfin**

Our Chairman, Marcus B. Fennell, sent me a copy of a letter he wrote on 95-02-21 to the Systems Comptroller of the Canadian National Railways, Winnipeg.

Apparently about mid-1994, the CNR Winnipeg office stopped using their Cummins Model 53 perforator, and Mark, expressed an interest in the whereabouts of the perforator.

All of us have an interest in ensuring that this perforator is kept in hands which will not misuse it to create anomalies, and I am sure we all appreciate Mark's efforts on our behalf.

It seems to me that there are some implications that flow from the retirement of the C45 machine.

First, since it was the last perforator still in use, we are now in the BNA post-perforator era.

Second, since the stock of stamps perforated with pattern C45 may have taken some time to be used up, and may still not be exhausted, it will take some time for someone to discover "The Last Canadian Perfin".

With the recent change to 45¢ postage, we already know that it will be a 43¢ stamp, quite likely. Accompanying this article is a copy of a cover cancelled on March 31, 1995 with the 43¢ flag stamp, position 3 used as postage. It went through the sorting station at 6:28 a.m. on April 1, 1995.

Has any one seen a more recent usage? If not, I will assume that this cover is the one with the "Last Canadian Perfin", until someone finds a more recent usage. Somehow, April Fool's Day does not seem an appropriate final day, or does it?

# **Perfin Study Group Minutes - Annual Meeting - BNAPEX95 Edmonton, AB Sept. 2, 1995 - 2:30 pm.**

Hope I didn't miss anyone. A number of the above were not Study Group members but were interested in attending the meeting.

The chairman welcomed those present and thanked everyone for attending. As no one had volunteered to make a presentation, we would play it by ear as we went along.

The Annual Report of the Chairman was read. Moved by Mark Fennell seconded by Floyd McNey that the report be accepted. Carried.

The Treasurer's report of August 9th was read on behalf of Steve Koning. Moved by Mark Fennell seconded by Lorne James that the report be adopted. Carried. It was pointed out that since the preparation of this statement, the costs of producing and mailing the Perforator had been received and instead of the balance of \$889.44, it was, as of August 23, 1995, \$369.64. Steve felt that with the balance of \$889.44 we should consider spending some of these funds, however the chairman pointed out that the revised total was only \$100.00 more than a year ago, so the balance was not excessive.

As the current officers were willing to continue for the 1995-96 year, Barry Clarke moved they be nominated as a slate for re-election. The chairman called for further nominations from the floor for each office individually and there being none, Floyd McNey moved nominations cease seconded by Jack Benningen. Carried. These officers were declared elected by acclamation. Mark mentioned that he will be 75 in October and would not stand for office again next year as he will have completed 5 years as chairman by then and it is time for new blood with new ideas.

## **New Business**

The revision and publication of the 5th edition of the Handbook was mentioned, and as Jon Johnson, the current editor was present, he was asked to comment. He had in mind a target date of the fall of 1996 for this project. Any suggested changes, even as small as a spelling correction would be welcome and should be sent directly to Jon.

Considerable discussion followed on the handbook revision. The following is a summary of comments by Jon and suggestions by others present:

- The listings of Federal, Federal Department Officials and Provincial Government check lists were badly in need of revision.
- A suggested price range by Perfin Factor, based on the average auction prices realized, should be incorporated.
- Check on the use of a coil binding for future editions, however Jon pointed out that as BNAPS underwrote the cost of publishing handbooks, our hands were somewhat tied as to the type of publication and date of issue.
- The possibility of some back of the book advertising that might lower costs.
- Add a section for illustration of covers.



- That illustrations, face up, of the very scarce perfin be added.
- The reworked machines such as C14, C15 and C36 should be given a separate listing. To a suggestion that, for example, C14.1 be used, it was pointed out by computer users that this could be confused with position 1, so an alphabetical designation such as C14A would have to be used.
- New types would not be numbered in their proper sequence as it would mean renumbering all types after that new number, so they are added at the end of the sequence in which it fitted. For example, if a perfin "EA" was found, it should become E3, which would mean re-numbering existing E3 - E7, instead "EA" would become E8.
- A new type find would not be issued to the handbook, even if illustrated in the Perforator unless Jon had seen it personally. He gave an example of a supposed new find, that by a photocopy looked genuine, but under magnification proved to have had the holes drilled instead of punched.
- A section on how to detect OHMS forgeries should be added. Jon said this was a delicate area. It was pointed out that books and articles had been published about other forgeries in the stamp world so what was so different in this regard.

Lorne James reported that due to reduced participation in the ABC Survey it was not as successful as he had anticipated, however some adjustment in some perfin factors was indicated.

Barry Clarke and Lorne James said they needed more "lead time" in order to bid on Conrad's auctions, especially Barry of New Zealand, who stated it can take up to 6 weeks for the Perforator to arrive.

Mark wondered if the Study Group could undertake a project of trying to list all known perfins by type and position and even take this a step further by attempting a pricing guideline. Jon mentioned that the best way to do this was not by a survey but by publishing known information and then asking for updates. No decision was made.

Barry Clarke had met with the Perfins Club of the USA on his trip to BNAPEX95 and he was asked to present a suggestion from them that we consider a joint meeting with them when the next BNAPS convention was in the USA.

A Guide to Perfin Exhibiting, prepared by the Perfins Club of the USA, was presented to our Study Group by Barry. A suggestion was made that it be circulated to BNAPS and the Royal for use and benefit of their judges. Copies should be made available for our Study Group members who might contemplate exhibiting perfins.

Meeting adjourned 4:00 pm.

PS All suggestions made above will receive consideration, it may take more time to deal with some than others, but you will be kept informed.

# Report From The Secretary-Treasurer of The Perfins Study Group



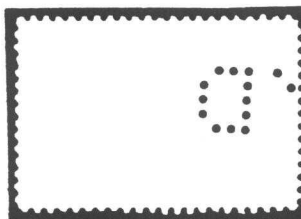
## "STUMP'D"

## OHMS Perfin Used as Postage Due?

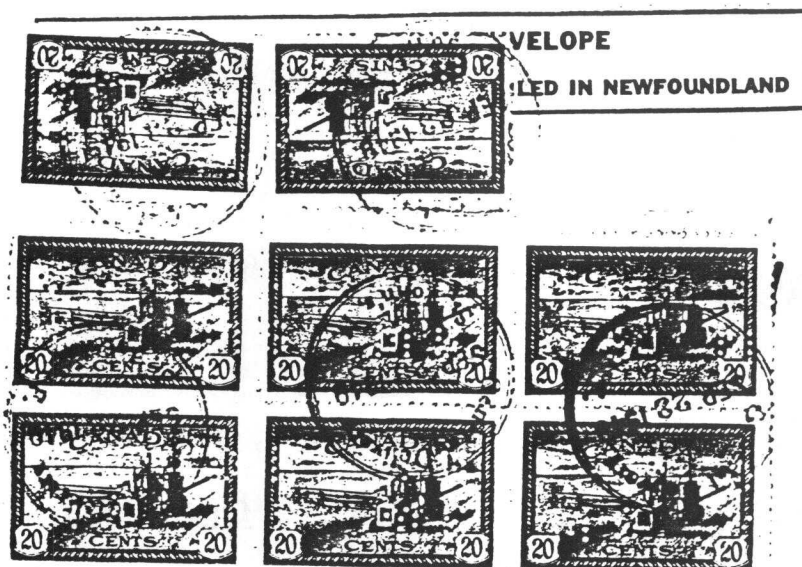
Barry Senior sent me a couple of interesting OHMS covers that appear to have been used as a kind of postage due payment. One cover ties eight 20¢ OHMS perfinned Peace issues with "General Delivery / Sept. 23, 1949 / St. John's, N.F." CDS cancels. It also bears a split ring "Bell Island Mines/SP 20/49/ Newf'd" free strike. The cover is addressed to "REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF FAMILY ALLOWANCES, ST. JOHN'S, NEWFOUNDLAND". The cover also has the preprinted endorsements "BUSINESS REPLY ENVELOPE / NO POSTAGE STAMPS NECESSARY IF MAILED IN NEWFOUNDLAND" and "RETURN / POSTAGE / GUARANTEED".

Barry also supplied a partial cover to the same addressee but postmarked OC 7/49 from Bonavista with four 20¢ OHMS perfinned Peace issues applied and cancelled in St. John's on Oct. 11, 1949. These stamps have actually been applied overtop of the Bonavista cancel proving that the stamps had indeed been applied in St. John's by the receiver.

We have the following questions. 1) Why were the stamps applied and cancelled at their destination? 2) Why is there \$1.60 and 80¢ respectively in postage on these envelopes? 3) Were there no postage paid in cash receipts or meters available? 4) Why did they not use regular postage due stamps?

My theory is that these envelopes were attached to boxes of Family Allowance Enrollment cards collected by the local governments and forwarded to St. John's for processing. If my memory of high school Canadian History is correct, wasn't the fact that "Baby Bonus" cheques would be made available to those families that qualified for them as part of the agreement for Newfoundland joining Confederacy in 1949? Is so, then this would tie in correctly as the dates are only a few months after Newfoundland joined Confederation.

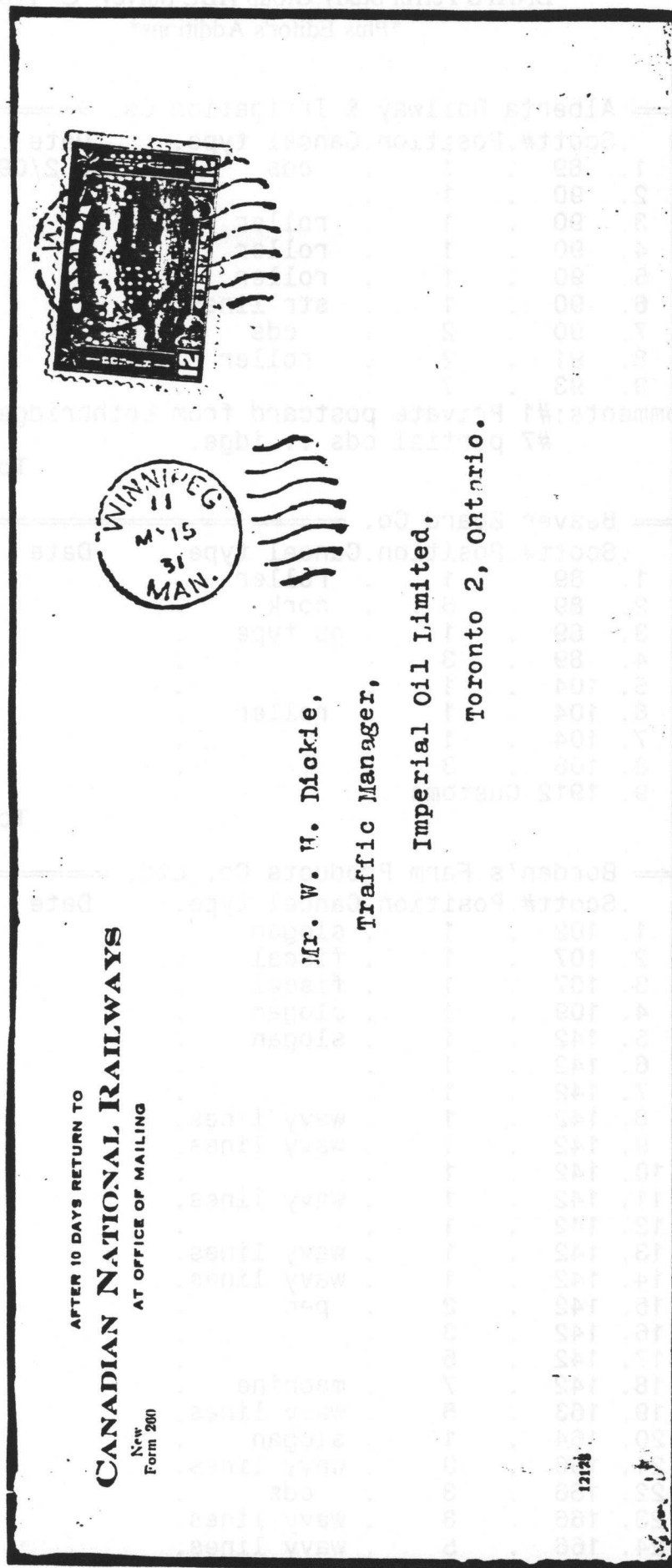
