Canadian Re-entry Study Group

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Canada 1897 Jubilee 10¢ Major Re-entry

In my first newsletter I reported finding a copy of the above stamp, Scott #57. Since that time I have found that a number of people were unaware of the existence of this re-entry. Apparently the first report of this re-entry appeared in 'Maple Leaves', Dec. 1962, in an article by H. Sanders. The photograph accompanying his article is reproduced here. I have resisted the temptation to retouch the details of the re-entry to make them clearer and more easily seen as I believe that would look too artificial.

Signs of the re-entry are found all over the stamp. Particularly clear is the doubling in the central crown, the 'R', the left leg of the 'V', 1837, 1897, and 'TEN CENTS'. Doubling is also found in the lower portions of both portrait ovals, the face and neck areas, 'PO' of 'POST-AGE', inside the lower frame line (below 'TEN CENTS'), and above the design at the top over the crown and the second 'A' of 'CANADA'.

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There was only one plate of 50 subjects used (5 X 10) and this reentry is found in position #5, the U.R. corner of the sheet, as seen in the reproduction. The total number of stamps printed was only 150,000, meaning 3000 sheets of 50. This re-entry is most likely a fresh entry appearing on all 3000 sheets. With such a small number to ever exist, this is quite a rare stamp ... more than five times as rare as the \$5

** NEW FINDS **

from Hans Reiche, Ottawa:

Scott #90 2¢ Edward VII - a block of four precancelled Quebec, Que. with a re-entry in the U.L. stamp --- lines left of the left frame line, left of 'C' in oval of 'CANADA', in oval lower left junction line, left of numeral.

from Dr. J.M. Sendbuehler, Ottawa:

Scott #36 2¢ Small Queen - four <u>different</u> Major re-entries. (More information to follow in a future issue.)

from Ralph Trimble, Toronto:

Scott #17 10¢ Cents Issue 1859 - the "Double Epaulettes" variety.

To quote Whitworth, "These were caused by a faulty lay down of the transfer roll, and the incomplete burnishing off of the mistake. Parts of the words 'CANADA POSTAGE' and the two northern X's remained to cause a series of blemishes on the line of the shoulders of the Prince Consort." This copy is rather faded, centred to the L.L. and has two missing perfs.

Not a terrific copy, but all of the details of the re-entry

PROVINCIAL RE-ENTRIES : NEWFOUNDLAND

Although our group is called the 'Canadian' Re-entry Study Group, I certainly think that we can include the Provinces in our studies. In fact, if sufficient interest warrants it and we have the contributions of material to support it, a regular column on Provincial Re-entries would be quite welcome.

I would like to start things off with a concern about Newfoundland

re-entries, or rather the lack of them.

I have seen references to re-entries on the Pence and First Cents Issues up to 1896, and of course the re-entries on the Long Coronation Set of 1937-38 are fairly well-known, though not all of them have been listed. (I have a lovely one on the THREE CENTS, Scott #234, that I will describe in a future issue.) I have also found re-entered copies of #191, 5¢ Caribou, to be quite common and easy to locate. However, what about the other issues? For example, has anyone found re-entries on the 1919 Trail of the Caribou Issue (#'s 115-126), or the Publicity or Resources issues? How about the 1935 Silver Jubilee (#226-229) or the 1937 Omnibus Coronation Issue (#230-232)?

Are there any Newfoundland Specialists out there who can help us?
