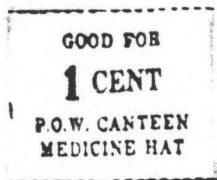

Canadian WWII POW Scrip *By Neil Shafer*

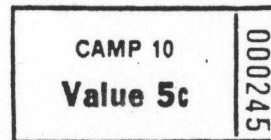
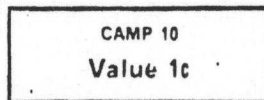


Camp 130

Canadian Prisoner of War Camp 130 (Kananaskis, Alberta) used cent, five, 10 and 50 cent notes; also \$1 and \$5 in a 1946 issue. Lethbridge, Alberta, Camp 133, and Medicine Hat, Alberta, Camp 132, also issued "canteen chits," a form of scrip used by internees and POW inmates in various Canadian camps.



CAMP 10 Chatham, Ontario

Black print on pale yellow cardboard; no date. All except the 1c have a black serial number.

Denominations: 1c, 5c, 10c, 25c and \$1.

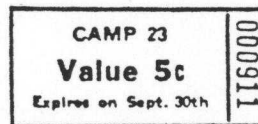

CAMP 20 Gravenhurst, Ontario

Black print on cream or white cardboard; no serial number. All are stamped with a green stamping which reads GOODS RECEIVED and partial date 194-.

Date: Good For JANUARY-JUNE 1946.

Denominations: 5c, 10c, 25c, 50c and \$1.



CAMP 23 Monteith, Ontario

Two separate issues are represented for this camp.

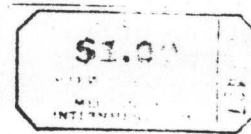
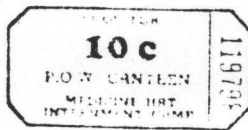
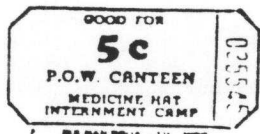
First Issue: black print on green cardboard with red stripe vertically in center. Date: Expires (on) Dec. 31, 1945.

Denominations: 1c (no serial number) and \$1 (with serial number).

Second Issue: black print on blue cardboard. All except the 1c have a black serial number.

Date: Expires on Sept. 30th (year?).

Denominations: 1c, 5c, 10c, 25c and \$1.



CAMP 132 Medicine Hat, Alberta

All are made of pink cardboard; the 1c is rectangular and the rest are in the style of theater tickets. Printer for all except the 1c is Bulman Bros., Winnipeg. All are undated.

1c: brown print; no serial number.

5c: black print; black serial number.

10c, 50c and \$1: red print; red serial number.

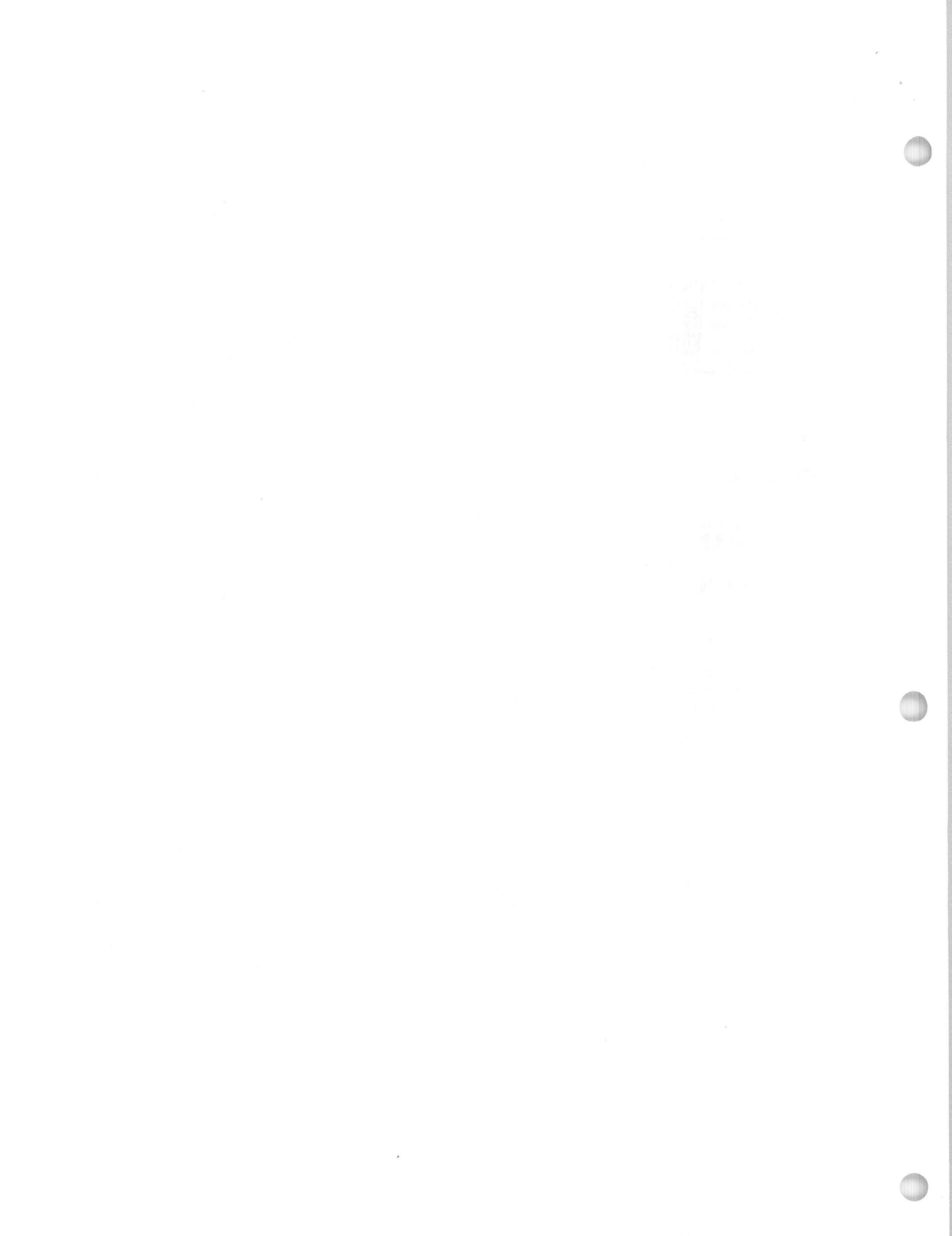

CAMP 130 Kananaskis, Alberta
(Later as Seebe, Alberta)

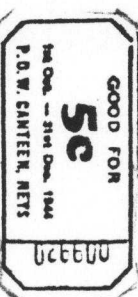
First Issue: black print on blue cardboard; no serial number.
Date: Jan.-June 1946.
Denominations: 1c, 5c, 10c, 50c, \$1 and \$5.
Dimensions: 1c through 50c are progressively larger squares; the last two are rectangular.
Second Issue: Another issue is known from Kananaskis Camp, but of an entirely different format as shown. Of this issue only the 5c denomination has been verified, though Dr. Arnold Keller reports a 10c and 25c. Black print on yellow cardboard. No date or serial number.



INTERMENT CAMP 133 Lehighridge, Alberta
(Earlier at Ozada, Alberta)

Black print on light yellow cardboard. No date but has a black serial number. Printer was Bulman Bros. in Winnipeg. Resembles theater tickets in appearance. Denominations: 1c, 5c, 10c, 25c, 50c, \$1 and \$5.
METAL TOKENS: Slabaugh catalogs brass tokens of 5c, 10c and 25c under the camp. As far as is known this constitutes the only issue of metallic POW money in Canada.

Canteen tickets from the last four camps listed here were printed without the respective camp numbers. These numbers are known and are shown here.
CAMP 21 Espanola, Ontario
Scrip in denominations of 30c and 50c is reported by Dr. Arnold Keller.



CAMP 100 Neys, Ontario

All are on white or light buff cardboard, and all have a red serial number. Scrip is that of a theater ticket.
Date: 1st Oct.—31st Dec. 1944.
Denominations and colors verified: 1c red, 5c black, 10c red and 50c green. (25c, \$1 and \$5 reported by Dr. Arnold Keller.)
