It was mainly through Ed's effords and enthusiam that the Revenue Group of BNAPS has continuously excisted. Ed started a Revenue Newsletter in 1962 which he issued until 1968. Ed's number in the Revenue Group was # 1.

W. H. Steinmetz # 120 - an early member of the Revenue Group. Bill Steimetz was a loyal member and a generous contritor to the Revenue Newsletter. We will miss Bill.

The issue of the Newsletter illustrated the Chinook Consrvation Stamp. Correction this stamp was not issued by British Columbia, but it is a Federal Revenue Stamp.

Ian McTaggart Cowan informs me; Largely as a consequence of over fishing the number of thisspecies returning to the spooning grounds in some of our major rivers have declined seriously. To attempt to reverse the trend the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans, that has jurisdiction over all salt water fishing in Canada, has set special seasons and bag limits on the catch. Part of the conservation effort is the issuance of the revenue stamp that must be bought and attached to the fishing licence of every angler seeking and catching Chinook Salmon.

Because Chinook Salmon occur only along the Pacific Coast the stamps have so far been on sale only at licencing outlets in British Columbia. However I understand that they are to be
