



CAP. XXV.

*An Act to Amend Act 5 George V., Sess. 1, Cap. 1, entitled
"An Act Respecting Stamp Duties."*

[PASSED JUNE 5, 1915.]

SECTION 1.—Certain cheques and orders need not be stamped.

2.—Act 5, George V., Sess. 1, Cap. 10, amended.

BE it enacted by the Governor, the Legislative Council Enacting clause.
and House of Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows:—

1. No cheque upon a banker issued by the authority of a a Certain cheques and orders need not be stamped.
Department of the Government, or issued by any person or
body who is permitted by Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue unstamped cheques, and no Post Office Money Order or Postal Order shall be stamped, and any such cheque upon a Banker, Post Office Money Order, or Postal Order not stamped, may be pleaded and given in evidence, and shall be admitted to be good, useful and available in law and in equity.

2. The Schedule to the Act 5 George V., Sess 1, Cap. 10, Act 5 George V., Sess. 1, Cap. 10, amended.
entitled "An Act respecting Stamp Duties," is hereby
amended by the addition of the following words and figures:

Receipts for any sum of money exceeding ten
dollars (\$10.00) 2 cents.

UNDER the provision of the Stamp Act, 1898-1914, as amended by 6 George V. (1915), Cap. 25, the following Rules and Regulations respecting Stamp Duties have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

- 1—Every instrument shall be stamped on its face.
 - 2—Cancellation of Stamps shall be made by person cancelling by writing name or initials, with date, across Stamp.
 - 3—Bills of exchange, Cheques, and Promissory Notes, Bills of Lading, Shipping Receipts, Charter Parties, and Receipts for Money, shall be stamped and the Stamps thereon cancelled:
 - (1) Bills of Exchange, Cheques and Promissory Notes drawn in the Colony by the person signing the same. Provided that in the case of a Banker, the Banker to whom it is presented for payment may, if it is unstamped, stamp the same and cancel the stamp.
 - (2) Bills of Exchange, Cheques and Promissory Notes drawn or made outside the Colony by the person into whose hands same shall come before the same is paid or negotiated.
 - (3) Bills of Lading and Shipping Receipts by the shipper. Provided that if presented unstamped they may be stamped by person receiving same.
 - (4) Charter Parties by the Charterer.
 - (5) Receipts for sums of Money over \$10.00, by the person signing the same.

4—The person on whom the obligation to stamp and cancel is imposed by these Rules, shall be deemed to be a person issuing an instrument, and if he issues such an instrument without its proper stamp or without properly cancelling same, he shall be liable to the penalties imposed by Section 23 of the Act 61 Victoria, Cap. 14, entitled "An Act respecting the payment of certain fees and charges by stamps."
