I REALLY HIT THE HOT BUTTON

When I asked for interest in covers with more than four R.P.O. cancellations, I received letters from Hugh Aitken (29), Bill Robinson (20), Charles Blair (39), and Ralph Jackson (15) in that order. Hugh enclosed xerox copies of two covers with six different strikes on registered letters. Picture of clearest example is attached. Bill sent examples of covers with 4 and 5 different strikes and told me about his coming article in Topics on the seven strike cover. This is quite a cover, with one R.P.O. (W-189) listed twice since the date and indicia are different. As was covered in the article, this letter was not delivered and thus picked up its last two R.P.O. cancellations on its return to the sender. Charles sent another example of six different strikes (attached). This also is a real curiosity, since it was sent airmail but actually delivered by train. Both these copies with six different cancellations were delivered (no return strikes). Finally, Ralph sent several examples including a cover with eight separate R.P.O. strikes. This cover also was returned so that W80 is shown with two different dates and W131 with three different dates. Copy of this also attached.

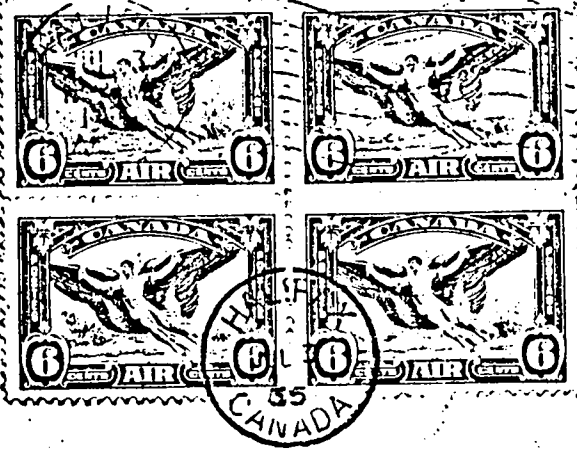

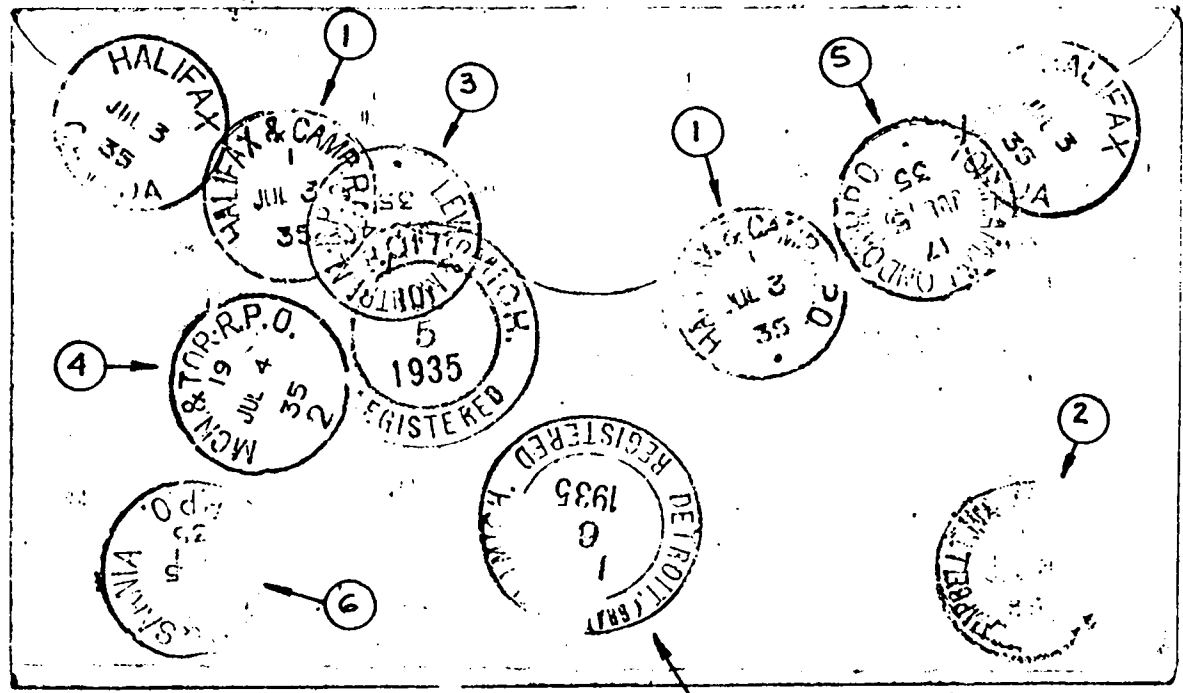

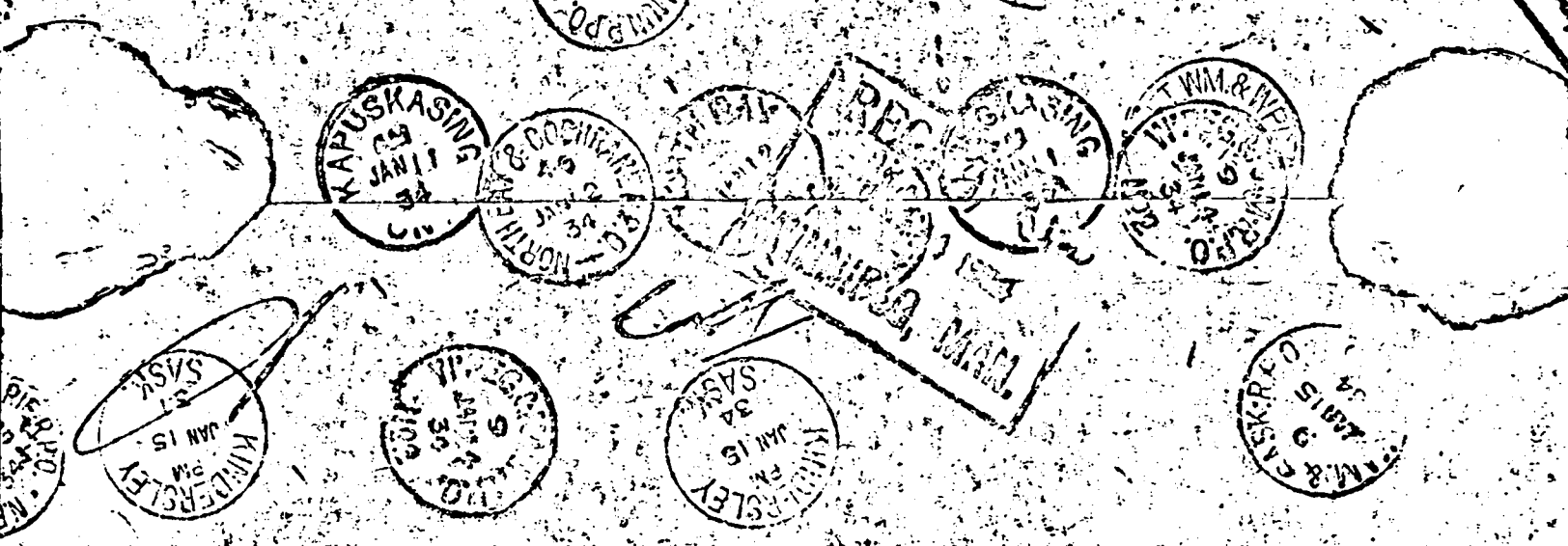
