

I hope this isn't becoming habit forming, but again we must report the death of a member - No. 18, <u>Joe Purcell</u>, of Kingston, Ont., on January 16, 1986. Joe was one of our more faithful correspondents, contributors, attenders at BNAPEX, and workers on behalf of the study group. Some years ago he prepared the roster of members' holdings which provided the basis for the R.F.listings in the new catalog. Joe was active in all phases of Canadian Postal History and will be sadly missed by his many friends and colleagues. Trained as a pharmacist, Joe spent many years in the Canadian Army both overseas in World War II, and later in the Regular peacetime Army. He was an acknowledged expert on Canadian military postal markings, and had written articles on MOONs, POCONs, the small square markings, and airport cancels. He also was an expert on world-wide PERFINs, and had attended BNAPEX in Calgary last fall. Although in failing health for some time, he accepted this philosophically, and continued to pursue his hobby diligently - note his contributions in the last several News Letters. Joe and his pipe will be missed.

KINGSGATE & YAHK (Canadian) R.P.O. and EASTPORT & SPOKANE (U.S.)

Following John McCrea's comments on page 4 of the last News letter, we received an example of the Canadian useage of W-34, EASTPORT & SPOKANE / R.P.O., the U.S.R.M.S. duplex from Jon Johnson. This was mailed January 5, 1952, by the Canadian Immigration Inspector at Kingsgate, B.C., to Vancouver, B.C. It travelled by Spokane International Train No. 2 to Yahk, where it connected with Kettle Valley Train No. 11. Your Editor also found the card below showing Kettle Valley Train No. 12, eastbound on the Yahk siding about 1906, waiting for a meet - possibly with the train from Spokane.



MARITIME COAL & RAILWAY CO., LIMITED

by J.C.Hornsby

Incorporated in 1883, under Province of Nova Scotia statute, as Joggins Railway Company. Authorized to construct a railway from a point on Bay of Fundy at or near Joggins to a point on the Intercolonial Railway at or near Maccan. The route is shown on the attached topographic map.

1886 - 1887 Line constructed

1888 Name changed to Joggins Coal and Railway Company, and extension built to Young's Mills from River Hebert.

- 1892 Incorporation of Canada Coals and Railway Company, under Nova Scotia statute, to own and operate mining properties, acquire railways, etc.
- 1892 November 1 Under this same statute, Canada Coals and Railway Company purchased the holdings of Joggins Coal and Railway Company.

1903 Subsidy requested from Dominion of Canada to construct branch line to Minudie.

1903 - 1904 Maritime Coal and Railway Company incorporated, under Nova Scotia statute, to own and operate mining properties, acquire railways, etc.


1904 - May Canada Coals and Railway Company went into receivership and in 1905 property sold at auction. Purchasers organized the Canada Coal and Railroad Company to take over mines, railway, etc.

Maritime Coal and Railway Company name changed to Maritime Coal, Railway and Power Company and in June 1907, this firm purchased the assets of Canada Coal and Railroad Company.

Line constructed to Chignecto from Maccan under Dominion of Canada statute.

Maritime Coal, Railway and Power Company's lines declared to be for general advantage of Canada. At this time Railway consisted of a main line from Maccan to Joggins; branches from River Hebert to Minudie, and from Maccan to Chignecto. Line to Minudie abandoned in 1917; Maccan to Chignecto lifted October 1934. Since then the entire trackage has been removed.



DD38 - 13 copies (1924 to 1961) both hammers, all have indicia Year / Month Day / Time Mark. DD96 - Hammer 1 - add 2¢ Map, 5 & 8¢ Numeral. " 2 - add 2 & 10¢ Numeral.

3 - delete 10¢ Numeral (was Hammer 2). DD102 - Time Mark 9 / AP 22 / 51.

Jim also questions how two copies of DD18 PM/DE 2/03can have one with DE 2 aligned, the other with DE_2 ?
