CN's Canada-U.S. tunnel under siege

FEARING a major loss of container traffic to the Port of Halifax, five major U.S. East Coast ports and the City of New York have asked U.S. Secretary of State Warren Christopher to veto CN North America's \$200-million tunnel project connecting Michigan and Ontario.

CN began work this spring on the new rail tunnel adjacent to one it owns beneath the St. Clair River linking Sarnia, Ont., and Port Huron, Mich. When completed late next year, it will be the only Canada-U.S. rail tunnel capable of accommodating double-stack container trains.

CN, which will be the tunnel's sole owner and user, expects to gain a major advantage over rail competitors when the project is finished late next year. By eliminating river barging for double-stack equipment, it will cut transit

times in the Montreal-Toronto-Chicago corridor by 12 hours.

President Bill Clinton, acting on the recommendation of Christopher, must issue an international border crossing permit for CN to open the tunnel for business. Christopher's recommendation is expected to be revealed imminently, a CN spokesman said.

Double-stack container trains have become critical tools for North American ports in selling the merits of their reach into the U.S. interior to international ship-

ping lines.

Frank Caggiano, chairman of the New York-based North Atlantic Conference of Port Authorities, said in an April 27 letter to Christopher the CN project "would injure, rather than serve, the national [U.S.] interest" because it would give the Port of Halifax "a substantial and unfair competitive advantage over U.S. North Atlantic ports" in handling container traffic to and from Chicago.

Caggiano, whose group includes the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, urged Christopher to "preserve the spirit of free trade between the U.S. and Canada by not permitting one Canadian government railroad to acquire a monopoly in an important transportation market, thereby preferring a single Canadian port over its

U.S. competitors."


The conference, along with CP Rail System, a division of Canadian Pacific Ltd., and the cities of Detroit and Windsor, say the CN project should be scrapped and a \$120-million enlargement of CN's and CP's jointly owned tunnel at Windsor-Detroit be undertaken to accommodate double-stack equipment. This tunnel is shared with CSX Corp., Consolidated Rail Corp. and Norfolk Southern Corp., and offers shippers competitive choice, the conference said.

CN flatly rejects the port group's allegations, said Robert Schellig, corporate general manager for CN in Detroit.

Schellig said trucks, not railways, dominate the container transportation market between Chicago and Toronto, and CN at best expects to gain only a 10% share of that market.

O-294L POR. JCT. & HEARST / R.P.O. XII, V 12, 52 commercial use on a 4c postal stationery envelope from Fauquier, Ontario to Toronto showing a very unusual Roman numeral indicium. (ex Moulton)





TRAIN No. / Tor. & Sar. R.P.O. No. 4 34, JAN 30, 1920 a previously unreported TYPE 5I cancellation, struck in black as a transit backstamp on a registered cover originating in Toronto, addressed to PROSPECT HILL, ONT., "Not Called For" and returned to Toronto. (ex Moulton)

Proof date is unknown. The line opened to traffic August 4, 1884.



O-129 KING & SH-LAKE / M.C. N, DE 26, 88 The PERTH, ONT DE 27, 88 arrival backstamp confirms the year. The hammer was proofed two months earlier, October 26, 1888. From Ross Gray
Special Delivery covers originating on an R.P.O.



Q-90 MONT. & IS' POND NIGHT / N^{0} 2 W, SP 14, 98 There is no arrival backstamp.






