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



It seems logical that this hammer and possibly a No.2 may have replaced O-344. A PROOF exists of TOR.& HAM. R.P.O./ No.3, dated AU 2/18. Why have these not been reported ? Did long distance mail get Toronto, Hamilton & London markings, and only local mail the Toronto & Hamilton cancels ? Reports from our Ontario specialists would be appreciated. Look at your collections these may be hidden with other markings.

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

In a scene reminiscent of Yukon gold-rush days of a century ago, the White Pass depot in Skagway, Alaska was the site two months ago of a ceremony that officially designated the White Pass & Yukon Railway as an international historic civil engineering landmark.

Hosted by the ASCE Alaska Section, the Sept. 10 event had everything going for it, including an old-time Western town for its setting, ancient railway cars and locomotives as picturesque backdrops, and a troop of Royal Canadian Mounted Police for a little local color. It also had representatives of ASCE and the Canadian Society for Civil Engineering, the two groups that paid tribute to American and Canadian engineers who conceived, designed and constructed the 110 mi, narrow-gauge railway in 1900, the purpose of which was to develop the Yukon's gold fields (and ever since has provided a major transportation link to the region).

Some 400 people turned out for the ceremony, which was preceded the evening before by a banquet held during a meeting of the ASCE Pacific Northwest Council in Juneau, Alaska. At the dinner, author Roy Minter, who wrote *White Pass: Gateway to the Yukon*, held his audience spellbound with his tales of times gone by.
