A New Ticket Stamp Discovery by Ross Gray



TKS-30, CAN. PAC. R'Y CO. / KALMAR., SEP / 27 / 1898, Type SPX, R.F. - G

The Canadian Pacific Railway station agent's ticket stamp, struck in blue, through cloth, was used as a cancellation on this cover from Kalmar, Ontario to Brookfield, Washington on September 27, 1898. The Brookfield receiving backstamp is dated October 3, 1898.

Kalmar was located in Kenora District, Broderick Township at C.P.R. mile 1314 (from Montreal) between Port Arthur and Winnipeg. The Kalmar post office opened for the first time on September 1, 1898, just 26 days before the date on this envelope. The first postmaster was S. T. H. Tighe and he resigned on October 8, 1898. The post office closed on October 6, 1900 and then re-opened on March 1, 1907 and finally closed on January 31, 1909.

The PHSC database shows that a split ring cancellation is reported from A? 2, 1899 to AP 8, 1900, during the first period of operation. No proof date is known for that cancellation.

This registered cover from Basrah, Iraq was mailed on July 29, 1933 and was addressed to "Mr. A. W. Twiner, 187 Gough Ave, Canada". Somewhere, someone added "America" in pencil. There is also a 3 line rubber stamp in violet, "RETURN FOR BETTER DIRECTION / RENVOYÉ POUR MEILLEURE / ADRESSE", which was likely applied in Montreal and has been struck out in pencil and the addition of "Try Toronto / Ont." has been hand written in ink.

The first transit postmark is "MONTREAL / CANADA , 11 AM, AU 16, 33". The next marking is a square boxed, "H. G. / TR. 1 , AUG / 17 / 1933", followed by , "POSTAL STATION -- / TORONTO, ONT., AM, AU 18, 33" and "TORONTO ONT. / REG. DIV. TERMINAL A , AU 18, 33". I also note a circled "24" in pencil adjacent to the clerk stamp which may have been the tracking number that he assigned.

I believe that the letter was misdirected at Montreal to the MONTREAL, COTEAU & OTTAWA R.P.O. car on westbound C.N.R. train 1 and that clerk, "H. G." worked on that R.P.O. . (It should have been directed to a westbound C.N.R. train to Toronto via Kingston.) He recognised the error and the cover was then probably sent west from Ottawa to Toronto by rail in closed bag registered mail. According to contemporaneous timetables, C.N.R. train 1 to Vancouver left Montreal at 8:10 PM and arrived in Ottawa at about 9:25 PM. There would have been time to transfer it to a Toronto bound train, probably C.N.R./C.P.R. Pool train 33 leaving Ottawa at 10.45 PM and arriving in Toronto via Peterborough at about 7 AM for delivery in that city later the same morning. It has been noted that there was also a C.P.R. train 1 operating from Montreal to Vancouver via Ottawa and North Bay at the time and that train carried the Montreal & North Bay R.P.O. but that train did not leave Montreal until 10:15 PM and arrived in Ottawa at 1:00 AM, too late to connect with any Toronto bound trains to arrive in Toronto before noon.

I was tempted to list this clerk stamp with the Montreal, Rigaud & Ottawa R.P.O. cancellations but will list it as **QC-564.55**, H. G. / TR. #, type BX1R, R.F. - G, with other examples of clerk handstamps without specific runs. Other examples may be reported indicating use by this clerk on other R.P.O. routes.

Is this the same clerk with the initials H G attached to a steel hammer and who is already known by the following listings?

New Reports & Updates



Colin Lewis shows us the only reported example of **MT-201**, TPO HX - YARM , which is dated June 5, 1937 by the Halifax machine cancellation. We have corrected the catalogue listing to show that there are no periods.



John Watson reports the second known example of a **new listing** which the editor added to the catalogue after reviewing all of the Robert Lee Auction catalogues to check for any previously undocumented data. It is **WT-482.021**, NELSON & MIDWAY · B.C. R.P.O. / . / P. N. DORLAND, E, AU 17, 17. (The latest example from the auction is dated 1928/01/24 with a "W" direction, current owner unknown.)

The cover is a registered Admiral cover from Hedley, BC. On the front there is a Hedley CDS dated AU 16 1917, exactly the same as the three strikes on the reverse. There is also a boxed R/Original Number connected to a blank circle in which has been written the number 963 in crayon. Two large "R"s in circles cancel the stamps. You can follow the route from the backstamps (note the dropped 0 of the month date in the WPG & M. JAW R.P.O.) as far as Winnipeg in Canada, then by boat to Liverpool. The Blackrock CDS is County Dublin Ireland, which was its original destination, but on the front is a Blackrock dispatcher because the cover was forwarded to Annamore, Skerries in Ireland. The Opened By Censor tape is British and has the number 1808 on the front.

New Reports from Ross Gray



Found on a postcard addressed to Orillia, Ontario, this lovely strike of **WT-192.02**, COR. & LAC \cdot R.P.O. / \mathbb{N}^{Q} 2 , 29, AU 16, 20 , is a **new early date** and the **first report of a train 29** indicium for this scarce hammer which was proof struck on May 16, 1919 for use on the Coronation & Lacombe run. Reported by **Ross Gray**.

Cancelling a post card from Ilderton to Hensall, is the first report of a **T2N** train number / direction indicium for **ON-245.01**, LONDON & KINCARDINE / - R^{Σ} .P.O. , T2N, FE 15, 93.





This September 6, 1875 date for MT-81, HALIFAX & ANNAPOLIS \cdot R \cdot R / _ , blank, SP 6, 75 , on a 3¢ Small Queen cover to Paradise, N.S., replaces the previous late date, June 24, 1875. The hammer is surprisingly worn for only having been used from August 24, 1874. There is no receiving backstamp.
