In this issue, **Brian Stalker** shares a transcription of an **1880 Toronto Post Office Report** containing a list of railway mail clerks and supporting staff. There are also new reports and updates from **Jack Brandt** and **Ross Gray**.

The editor includes several new assorted **hammer studies** which he hopes will encourage participation in this interesting aspect of specialised collecting.

This registered cover which is addressed to Brockville, originated at Spencerville on May 23 and was transferred to the northbound Ottawa & Prescott mail car the same day and received an **ON-413.02**, OTTAWA & PRESCOTT RAILWAY / **M**, MY 23, 1867, NORTH, backstamp, which is a new **early date**

for the hammer.

It has an Ottawa transit backstamp dated May 23, in the afternoon. Probably it was returned south the following day on the Ottawa & Prescott Railway in a closed bag for Brockville for transfer to the next westbound Grand Trunk Railway train at Prescott. The Brockville arrival backstamp is dated May 24.



On page 1881 of the May-June, 2005 newsletter, we separated three hammers of **ON-413**, OTTAWA & PRESCOTT RAILWAY / **W**. There was further information including the possibility of an, as yet, unconfirmed fourth hammer on page 2265 of the September-October, 2011 newsletter.


William G. Robinson Award


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ON-398 Hammer Study from Ross Gray

This study is based on preliminary work done by Lewis Ludlow and published in the January-February, 1980 issue of Topics.



The unusual stamps, as well as the unlikely addressee and destination, strongly suggest that this cover is a philatelic creation. I am guessing that the sender deliberately deposited the cover in the station platform letter box for westbound mail, which was cleared by the R.P.O. clerk on train 9 (hence the "9" tracking number) at 3:00 AM on January 13. The clerk set it aside for special treatment until the return trip on eastbound train 18, which stopped again at Woodstock at 5:09 PM. He cancelled the stamps with **ON-659.01**, TOR. LON. & WIND. / R.P.O. , 18, I 13, *blank*, and sorted it into a closed bag for air transmission to Edmonton. There are January 14 and February 8, Edmonton transit backstamps in addition to a **ON-658.03**, TOR. LON. & WINDSOR / R.P.O. , 10, II 10, 60 and a February 10, Woodstock backstamp. The registration marking will be listed as **ON-663.55**, R] T. L. W. / # , Type RB2, Indicia 18, Period 1960/01/13, R.F. - G. (ON-659.01 and ON-658.03 are new LRDs.)



This interesting commemorative cover from Jack Brandt's collection is cancelled with **WT-64.052**, CALGARY & EDMONTON . R.P.O. / N $^{\circ}$ 5, 27, SP 27, 36 and is the first reported example of train 27 for the hammer.



Ross Gray was pleased to find this new **early dated** example of **QC-384**, QUE & CAMPBELLTON / \cdot LOCAL \cdot / 5 , E.1, JU 8, 93 , struck in violet and used as a transit backstamp on this registered cover from St. Eloi to Montreal. It is also the first report of an **E.1 direction/ train number indicium**.
