There are updated hammer studies for ON-381, ON-383 and WT-687, a new hammer study for WT-686 which was suggested by **Brian Copeland** who observed two different hammers and a new one for ON-540.



This cover is from Lindsay Russell, Deputy Minister of the Interior, 1882-1883 to Dr. Robert Bell, an employee of the Geological Survey of Canada from 1857 until 1908. It has the latest reported date and only known example of the NORTH direction of WT-686.02, SI VINCENT & WINNIPEG / P.C., NORTH, AU 11, 83, used as a transit back-stamp.

Jim Felton sends this interesting clipping from the May 15, 1911 issue of the "DAILY BULLETIN of ORDERS AFFECTING THE POSTAL SERVICE" published by the U.S.P.O. It refers to American and Canadian R.P.O. connections at the Minnesota -Manitoba border.

This registered cover to Bellarat, Australia, from Carievale, SK (located 66 miles east of Estevan on the Brandon-Napinka-Estevan CPR line) was mailed on August 3, 1909 and transferred to

WT-877.03, WINNIPEG & ESTEVAN R.P.O. / N^{Ω} 3 , W, AU 3, 09 (The first report of the 'W' direction for the hammer.). It arrived at Estevan the following day and was put on board the

WT-522.01, C.P.R. NORTH \cdot PORTAL & MOOSE \cdot JAW \cdot M.C. / N $^{\circ}$ 1 , W, AU 4, 09 for the trip to Moose Jaw.

From there it apparently played musical trains! There are 3 different Moose Jaw & Calgary R.P.O. backstamps from one eastbound and two different westbound trains,

WT-381.022, M. JAW & CAL. R.P.O. / No 2, 1, AU 5, 09 and

WT-381.061, M. JAW & CAL. R.P.O. / Nº 6, 97, AU 5, 09 and

WT-383.091, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY / Nº 9, 96, AU 5, 09.

On one of these mail cars it was sorted into closed bag mail for Vancouver, arriving there on August 7. Arrival in Melbourne and Bellarat was on September 7.

A New Clerk Handstamp from the Hope & Vancouver R.P.O.

This registered cover addressed to Hanover, PA from Dewdney, BC (located 6 miles east of Mission and 41 miles west of Hope on the CPR Calgary-Vancouver main line) was postmarked on May 18, 1928. It was transferred to the Calgary & Vancouver R.P.O. on eastbound train 2 the same day. The following day it was received on the Hope & Vancouver R.P.O. on eastbound train 706, where the clerk used his personal handstamp, possibly due to a misdirection of the letter from the Calgary & Vancouver R.P.O. This previously unreported handstamp will be listed as,





John Aitken reports a new **late date** for hammer **WT-440.022**, M. JAW & MACKLIN · R.P.O. / Nº 2 , 311, DE 15, 55. It is used as a transit stamp on a registered cover from Herschel, SK to Vancouver along with **WT-724.01**, SASK. HARD. & ED. R.P.O. / No. 1 , 51, 15 XII, 55 .

Correction: There was a typo in the previous newsletter for the year date on the following item from John. The year was '69' as confirmed by several other accompanying postmarks on the cover.







Morris Beattie reports a new **late date** for hammer **WT-341.02**, M. H. & N. R.P.O. / B.C. , E, AP 14, 09.

We are grateful to **Fred Mason** of Roberts Creek, BC for reporting this unusual use of an RPO clerk's private handstamp. He writes as follows;

"I attach two JPGs of an RPO cancel found inside a book I recently picked up. The book itself is "The Luck Of The Mounted", By Ralph S. Kendall and published by S. B. Gundy in Toronto in 1920. The RPO shows a date of 1944. I bought the book at a flea market in Gibsons, BC and the seller had about 20 books of a similar vintage with the same cancel inside the front and back covers."

It is WT-574, Pr. George & Pr. Rupert R.P.O. / M. E. Prendergast , Tr. 196, MAR 10, 1944. Although the clerk used his stamp to identify his books, the indicia set would have been that which had been most recently used on the R.P.O. at the time of application. Therefore we shall accept this odd use as a new late date and first report of train 196.



Railway Post Office Study Group Meeting Report from Peter McCarthy
