A New Calgary & Vancouver Clerk Stamp

3 American Pevelopment Company For Β. NE C. REGISTERFD REGISTRAR OF JOINT-STOCK COMPANIES VICTORIA, B. C.

Morris Beattie shares this interesting registered cover which originated in Victoria on May 19, 1911 and was addressed to New Denver, BC located on Slocan Lake. It travelled in closed bag registered mail from Victoria to Vancouver for transfer to the eastbound Calgary & Vancouver RPO on train 96 and received a previously **unreported clerk's private handstamp** which will now be listed as **WT-107.55**, Calgary & Vancouver R.P.O. / J. S. FERGUSON , Tr. 96, MAY 20, 1911. The letter arrived in Nelson on May 21. After not being called for, it was next postmarked on June 2 on the westbound Calgary & Vancouver RPO on train 3. Arrival back in Victoria was the following day.

Suprisingly, **Jack Brandt** also subsequently reported the same clerk stamp with the same date and train number on an almost identical cover.

ON-540 Hammer Study Update

One of our most prolific contributors, Jack Brandt, has discovered an additional hammer for this listing which has been now listed as **ON-540.06**. Accordingly we have updated the hammer study which originally appeared in the October-December 2016 newsletter.

* The punctuation between the 'T' and the 'R' is a short hyphen for ON-722.01, a period for ON-722.02 and ON-722.03, and a colon for ON-722.04 and ON-722.05.



The tops of **ON-719.03** and **ON-719.07** are similar to **ON-722**. If the bottom portion of the strike is missing, measure from the top of the 'T' to the top of the 'R' of 'TOR'. This measurement is $5 \frac{1}{2}$ - mm for ON-719.03 and 5 mm for ON-719.07. This measurement is about 6 mm for all 5 hammers of ON-722.

Brian Stalker reports a new late date for **ON-37.01**, BRANTFORD & GODERICH $\cdot R^{\perp} P. O / . , W$, NO 18, 04, and a new early date for **ON-37.02**, BRANTFORD & GODERICH $\cdot R^{\perp} P. O / . , E$, AU 8, 98.





Brian also reports the first example of train 9 for hammer ON-719.03, TOR. & MONT. R.P.O. / 3, 9 FE 2, 25, as well as the listing.



Chris Anstead reports the first example of WT-192.011, COR. & LAC \cdot R.P.O. / Nº 1, E, AP 13, 26, with an 'E' direction indicium.

Murray Smith notes that the punctuation shown for **WT-192.012** in the catalogue is incorrect. There is a base period after 'LAC' not a mid position dot.





Murray Smith submitted this example of **MT-13.03**, CAMPBELLTON & LEVIS EXPRESS · R.P.O. / . , 1??, JAN 31, 52, as possibly having an unreported train number. The train number slug is worn and overinked making definite identification possible. The C.N.R public timetable in effect from November, 1951 showed no possibilities for a 3 digit train number being used on Campbellton-Levis trains however westbound train 135 and eastbound train 136 operated as local trains between Riviere du Loup and Levis daily except Sunday.

My conclusion is that this hammer was used on those local trains over only a portion of the Campbellton-Levis run during most of its 2nd period i.e. 1943/02/08 to 1960/03/22. The train numbers changed to **635** and **636** in 1958 with the advent of rail diesel cars instead of regular equipment. **Jack Brandt** reports **train 3** (Campbellton to Levis) for the hammer on August 10 and September 14, 1958. I have train 635 on August 23, 1958 leaving us to conclude that the hammer returned to its original run occasionally.

After further examination, I believe that a number of the Campbellton & Levis hammers were likely used on the Riviere du Loup – Levis run. I suspect that various RPO clerks based in Quebec-Levis were occasionally assigned to the shorter run and simply used their hammers which were normally used for the full run. Certainly there is more room for future investigation.

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
