A New Late Date for RY-58



This registered cover originated in Montreal on March 7, 1876 and travelled by rail in closed bag mail to Toronto, arriving the following day. It was sorted into closed bag mail for Georgetown, travelled by rail and arrived on March 8. It was then taken about 13 miles north west by road to Erin and arrived there on March 9. On March 20, having not been picked up by the addressee, the Erin postmaster added the notation, "*Try Acton*" and returned the letter to Georgetown where it arrived on March 21. It was transferred to the R.P.O. on the next westbound train where the mail clerk postmarked it with, **RY-58**, REGISTERED / $_{-}$ G. T. R. W $_{-}$, MR 21, 76, a new **late date** for this rare hammer. Arrival in Acton was the same day.

It is also notable that the postmark was **struck through cloth**.

Struck Through Cloth

Occasionally postmarks are found with a fuzzy outline and evidence of a woven fabric pattern in the impression. I believe that these examples were the result of the cancelling device being installed in a device similar to the one illustrated below. The illustration shows a ticket stamping machine which was used in a railway station on Prince Edward Island. All railway stations were equipped with these devices to validate railway tickets when they were sold. (Some station agents also used them to stamp both incoming and outgoing mail and other railway forms to indicate the receipt or dispatch location and date. Most of these markings are not postally significant.)








A typical railway ticket stamp impression

The c.d.s would be fastened in the base with the spring loaded hard rubber faced hammer above it. A wide inked cloth tape, much like a typewriter ribbon, ran between the c.d.s and the hammer and was automatically advanced with each strike.



QC-48.01 is distinguished by side dots before and after 'R.P.O.'.

QC-48.02 and QC-48.03 are very similar except for the presence or absence of a mid position dot and the spacing, chord 'a', between the 'E' and the 'J'. QC-48.02 has noticeable rim damage in the lower right quadrant late in its use.







QC-311 Hammer Study



The editor has not seen an example of hammer **QC-311.01** used. The only recorded date is the earliest date for the listing, 1951/11/18 which is derived from the Ludlow-Robinson written records with no source noted.

Hammer **QC-311.02**, proof struck on October 30, 1967, has only been seen by the editor on favour covers or facing slips dated between 1967/12/15 and 1971/04/24.

G.T.P. West of Wainwright R.P.O. Service from Rick Parama


Although the RPO was probably intended to begin operation in August of 1909 (when the first date stamps were proofed); the RPO did not begin operations until very late in 1909. A newspaper account of the start of open (RPO) mail operations was published in the **December 3rd**, **1909**, edition of the Edmonton Daily Bulletin. (The brackets are my notes; for clarity and there was a typo in the original newspaper article).

MAIL SERVICE ON G.T.P.

The first mail service over the G.T.P. east of Edmonton went into effect yesterday morning from Edmonton. There was attached to the regular [*regular* = *regular passenger train*] a mil [*sic mail*] car and this will be kept in operation along the line. The service will be an open one between Edmonton and Wainwright. The post office officials report that already there is a great deal of mail accumulating for points along the new line.

A New Quebec Clerk Handstamp

To be called tawa Ross Gray collection OUT Cle

This registered letter addressed to W. F. Ferrier at Broughton Station, Quebec, originated at Sand Banks, Ontario on August 5, 1891. After travelling by road, it arrived in Picton the same day, where it was probably sorted into closed bag registered mail and travelled north on the next Central Ontario Railway train for transfer to the next eastbound G.T.R train for Montreal at Trenton Junction.

Arrival in Sherbrooke was on August 6 and it was transferred to the next northbound Central Quebec Railway mail car for Broughton Station *(north of Thetford Mines on the Sherbrooke-Levis Quebec Central Railway line)*. On August 7, the railway mail clerk, who may have recently seen other mail addressed to Ferrier redirected, applied his clerk handstamp. He first wrote an undecipherable redirection location in indelible pencil, crossed it out and redirected it to Richmond, where it arrived on August 8. In Richmond it was again redirected, this time to Ottawa, where it arrived on August 11.

This previously unreported R.M.C. postmark will now be listed as, **RY-162.55**, J. M - - - LL, / QUEBEC CENTRAL RY. / Railway Mail Clerk., AUG 7 North, 1891., (Type OV1R, R.F. - G)

Ferd Belanger provided a Montreal District post office clerk roster list showing that there was a clerk named **John Miller Hall**, born August 29, 1855. He became a Post Office employee on September 1, 1886 and was appointed as a second class railway mail clerk on November 4, 1890. He is also listed under **QC-557** and **QC-564**.
