This registered cover addressed to Port Hope, Ontario, originated at Granlea, Alberta on October 14, 1919. It travelled northward by road to the CPR Medicine Hat-Nelson line where it was transferred to WT-344.011, MED. HAT. & NEL. R.P.O. /  $N^{\Omega}$  1, 12, OC 15, 19. At Medicine Hat, it was put on WT-381.11, M. JAW & CAL - R.P.O. /  $N^{\Omega}$  11, 4, OC 15, 19 and placed in closed bag mail for Winnipeg. At Winnipeg, it was placed in closed bag mail for Fort William. At Fort William it was transferred to ON-562.02, TOR. & FT. WM. R.P.O. /  $N^{\Omega}$  2, 4, OC 17, 19. At Toronto it was put on QC-303.03, MONTREAL & TORONTO · REG'D. / . , 18, OC 18, 19 and arrived in Port Hope on October 19.

QC-303.03 is an example of a newly recognized third hammer for listing QC-303. This cover is also notable for the illegal use of a  $4\phi$  revenue stamp to pay the  $8\phi$  registration plus letter rate postage.

#### New Reports from Brian Stalker



**Brian Stalker** has found a new and unique **second period date** for **QC-303.02**, MONTREAL & TORONTO · REG'D. / . , 26, DE 3, 31 , used on a regular letter rate commercial "window" cover from G. Daquest & Cie, Ste Anne de Bellevue, QC. This is also the first report of **train 26** for both the hammer and the listing. Interestingly, train 26 was a **C.P.R. train** operating on the Montreal-Smith's Falls-Toronto line, not a G.T.R/C.N.R. Montreal-Toronto R.P.O. as was usual with this hammer and listing.

Brian Stalker reported this example of QC-303 and observed that it did not appear to match the proof strikes for either of the two known hammers for the listing, leading to a new hammer study, which identified it as a previously unrecognized third hammer, QC-303.03, MONTREAL & TORONTO · REG'D. / . , 6, OC 3, 19.



## QC-303 Hammer Study

Although the three hammers were obviously intended for use on registered mail, they appear to be often used to cancel regular letter mail. It would interesting to know of other examples and how used. Study group members are requested to report their holdings.





## New Reports from Ross Gray





Used as a transit backstamp on this registered cover from Abbotsford to New Westminster, **WT-256.01**, HUNT. & VAN. R.P.O. / . , W, JUN 21, 04 , is a new **early date** for the hammer. It narrows the gap between the use of WT-255 and this hammer, whose proof date is unknown. A second hammer, WT-256.02 was proof struck on April 25, 1913 but is not reported used.



#### A New Ontario R.P.O. Clerk Name Attachment





We are grateful to **Laurent Bélisle** for reporting this **previously unknown clerk attachment** variety for hammer ON-458. It has now been listed as,

**ON-458.55**, PICTON & TRENTON · R.P.O. / Nº 2 / W. CHAPMAN. , 52, AU 2, 29.

The registered cover, addressed to Bloomfield, Ontario, originated at the Spadina Avenue P.O., Toronto, was transferred to Toronto, Terminal 'A' and then to eastbound **QC-296.112**, MONT. & TOR · R.P.O. / N<sup>Q</sup> 11 , 18, AU 1, 29. At Trenton it was transferred to the southbound Trenton to Picton R.P.O. where the clerk, W. Chapman, applied his temporarily modified hammer.

Chapman used the same attachment on hammer ON-407.02 between 1939 and 1943. That variety is listed as **ON-408**.


#### Double Train Number Indicia

Double train indicia are very unusual. The **Toronto & Ottawa R.P.O.** hammers **ON-781.01**, **ON-783.03** (only one report for the LRD 1914/05/15), **ON-783.04** and **ON-784** are found with **trains 33-21** for about a 5 year period between 1915 and 1920.



Apparently the Toronto-Ottawa R.P.O. car on train 21 was transferred to train 33 at Smith's Falls.


The 11-20 train combination with the train times shown for those two trains in several of the GTR timetables around the period are about 12 hours apart which would not make sense for connecting arrangements. Lacking a specific 1913 timetable for the only recorded date leaves us with a mystery for the pair.

## New Reports from Jack Brandt



A new listing, **E-25.012**, EDMONTON DISTRICT / · EMERGENCY  $N^{\Omega}$  1 · , 615, MR 16, 48 , was used on the **Lacombe, Breton & Edmonton R.P.O.** before arrival of the two regular hammers, WT-310.01 and WT-310.02, which were proof struck on March 4, 1948. (Jack has two similar examples on stamp dated February 2 and February 20 with blank indicia. Depending on when this R.P.O. began operation, the hammer may have been used on the R.P.O. on those earlier dates as well.)



A later example of the new listing, **E-25.012**, EDMONTON DISTRICT / · EMERGENCY No 1 · , 26, ?? OC, 61, apparently was used on train 26. Reviewing both the C.P.R and C.N.R 1961 timetables, only **train 626** from Edmonton to Drumheller comes close to a train 26. Since the clerk lacked a "526" train number slug, he substituted "26". Normally no R.P.O. operated on this route at the time but an accident on the Edmonton-Saskatoon C.N.R. main line might have necessitated a temporary rerouting of mail. The Saskatoon & Drumheller R.P.O. on trains 9 and 10 was still in operation at this late date, when many R.P.O.s had been discontinued, and it would have been available for mail transfer at Drumheller.


