# A NEW MARMORA, ONTARIO HAMMER - ALMOST!

Tom Almond of Reading, England sent a note indicating that he had found a strike of the MARMORA hammer which was different than the proof strike in the Fourth Edition Handbook. The principal difference was the shape and position of the first "R". A check of Tom's photocopy and the few strikes I have indicated the possibility of a second hammer for this town. I then compared the Handbook strike with the Pritchard and Andrews pages and found that the strike in the Handbook is in error. Evidently when I first strengthened the very light proof strike of MARMORA, the position of the "R" was altered. The P & A proof strike, the Handbook strike and the strengthened, correct proof strike are illustrated below.

#### NEW REPORTS AND FINDINGS

RIVER LOUISON, NEW BRUNSWICK - In J.C. Michaud's latest list, a new year of use is noted for this hammer; a strike on a 1 Cent Edward postcard dated -/SP 29/08.

NORTHPORT, NOVA SCOTIA - Also from Michaud's list is a second example of this hammer for the year 1902; strike is -/DE 8/02 on a 2 Cent Numeral Queen cover.

ST. HYACINTHE, QUEBEC - An inverted time mark is reported on a strike dated WV/OC 21/96.

CACHE BAY, ONTARIO - An update of Dr. Warren Bosch's report in the last Annex; the "O" time mark is on a strike dated O/MY 2?/OI.

MERRITTON, ONTARIO - A new year of use for this hammer was reported on a receiving strike on a postcard dated -/SP 9/01.

SUDBURY, ONTARIO - A new late date for this hammer was also in J.C. Michaud's list. The strike is on a 2 Cent Edward cover, with the strike dated AM/JAN 16/08. Note the borrowed three letter month indicia and that this date extends the hammer's period by over three years! This report also gives some support for the strike dated PM/MY 13/10 in the Fourth Edition Handbook.

## MEMBERSHIP CHANGES

Since the last ANNEX, there have been a number of changes in the membership, most notably the death of Frank Campbell in late October. For those of you who never had the opportunity to meet Mr. Campbell, he was really quite remarkable. I last saw Frank in April of this year, and even at age 97 (or was it 98?), he could still recall data such as office revenues, postmasters, etc. about almost any town you would ask.

Over the past few months I have received several resignations from the Study Group, including a letter from Wally Gutzman. I have included below an excerpt from Wally's letter which I hope you find of interest. It gives a unique glimpse into the early days of squared circle collecting.

" I have pleasant memories of the early days of Squared Circle collecting, when we were making up the first rarity factors and were more or less feeling our way in the dark. Those were the days when such collectors as Bradin Elliott, Clarence Kemp, Dr. McKee, Dr. Whitehead. H.E. Canham, E. Brakefield-Moore and myself were all trying to make 300 (strikes) first. We all had various systems of acquiring material and some were luckier than others in finding good towns. Dr. Whitehead had found a good supply of NEWPORT LANDING registered covers which made good trade material. He also used to offer the three hammers of ST. JOHN (N.B.) in return for a rarity, and I vividly recall sending him a beautiful STANSTEAD, as I lacked one of the ST. JOHN hammers at that time. Bradin Elliott, now deceased, was to me one of the fairest collectors of all to trade with, and we had a marvelous correspondence going..... The later group of Nels Pelletier, John Siverts, Doug Crawford, Stan Cohen, etc., etc. made the Squared Circle Group quite famous. "
