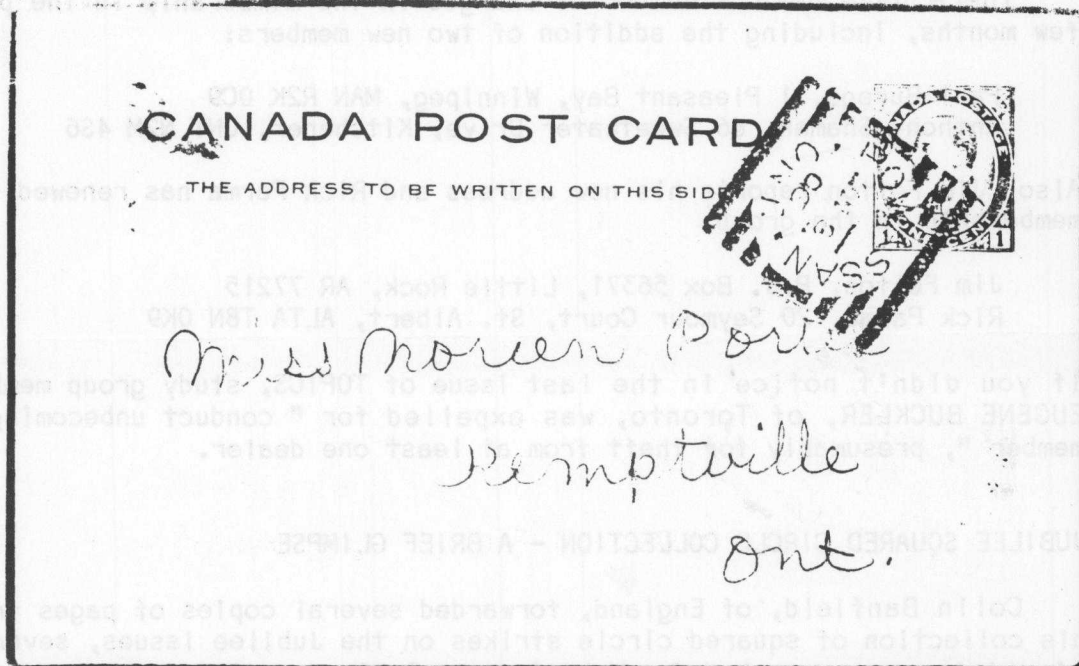

UPDATING THE LONDON BARRED CIRCLE MISSING "92"

Lot 512 in Bob Lee's RAL Auction No. 6 features a strike of the LONDON Barred Circle hammer dated AP 19 5P, with the "92" year date missing; this is one day earlier than previously reported. Referring to page 213 of Vol. 3, No. 5 ANNEX, note that this is the first reported strike for this date and that the April 18th strike has the year date. I have written to Bob requesting a copy of the strike and will include it in an upcoming ANNEX.

NEW REPORTS AND CORRESPONDENCE

BELLEVILLE,,HAMMER III - John Talman sent along a note that Lot 614 in his May 1, 1984 auction featured a strike of this hammer, dated 5/OC 24/96; this is apparently the second example of the "5" time mark for this hammer and is over a year later than the strike reported in the Handbook.



POWASSAN, ONTARIO - Ted Kerzner reports a new late date for this hammer; the strike on a 1 cent Edward postal stationery card, is dated -/JAN 8/06. This is also the first report of the use of a three letter month borrowed indicia for this hammer.

JUBILEE SQUARED CIRCLE COLLECTION - A BRIEF GLIMPSE

Colin Banfield, of England, forwarded several copies of pages from his collection of squared circle strikes on the Jubilee Issues, several of which are presented in this issue. Colin reports a strike of the RIVIERE DU LOUP STATION hammer, dated -/25 JU/97, which is considerably earlier than the Handbook date for this indicia arrangement. Finally, Colin included a brief want list which is included later in this ANNEX.

A NANAIMO STATE ONE REGISTERED COVER

In response to the request in the last issue of ANNEX, Emerson Clark sent along photocopies of a recent acquisition, this registered cover with multiple strikes of the NANAIMO State One hammer. The strikes are dated PM/SP 19/93; note that the use of the PM time mark predates the earliest date in the Handbook.

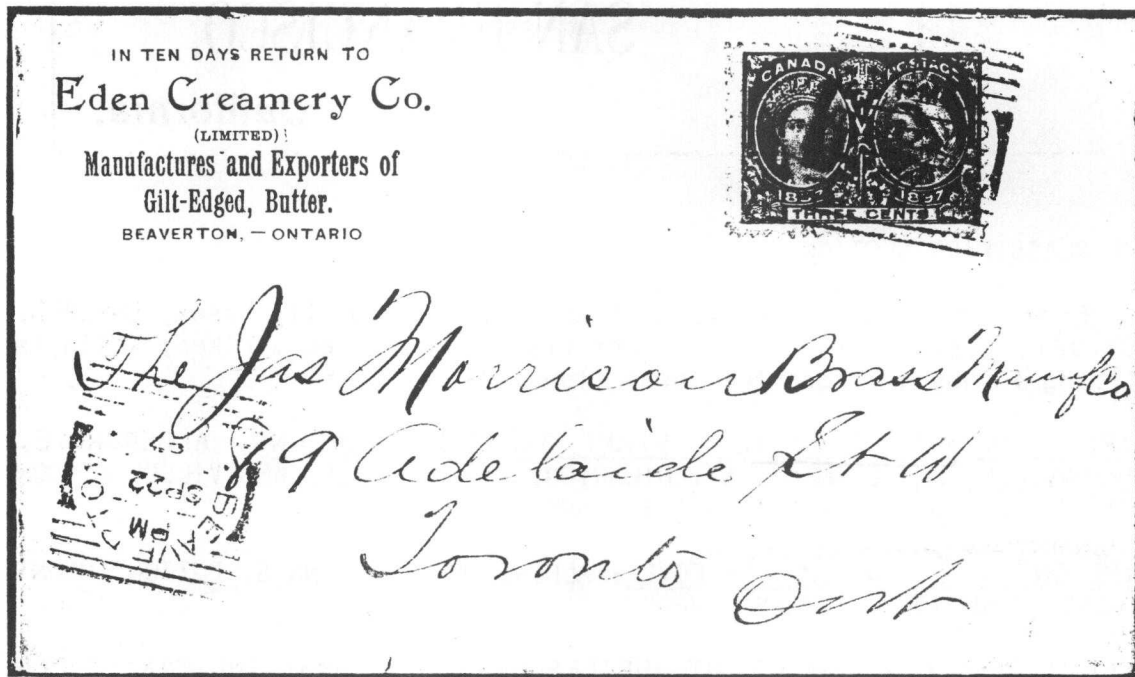

One of only four covers currently recorded bearing the 3c value.

Indicia numbers 1 to 5 inclusive above the date.

TYPE 2

The Type 2 squared circle cancellation consisting of thick lines at top and bottom, and thick side pieces, was used by approximately 218 towns during the Jubilee period. Some 223 different hammers are recorded, including Sub-types, and 7 R.P.O. cancellers.
