

#### REPORTS OF NEW FINDINGS

Reports of new finds have been reaching me on a somewhat regular basis over the past few months - THANKS! I would like to remind members that time and postage does not always permit acknowledgment of each report. Howver, please be assurred that the reports will appear in the ANNEX as soon as possible.

BAIE VERTE, NEW BRUNSWICK (BOB McCABE) - A new year of use with a strike dated -/AP 24/01.

RIVER LOUISON, NEW BRUNSWICK (BOB McCABE) - A new year of use with a strike dated -/AP 17/01.

HALIFAX, NOVA SCOTIA, HMR I (JERRY CARR) - A new late date with a strike dated 1/JY 22/99.

FARNHAM, QUEBEC (BOB McCABE) - A dated strike for 1907, -/? 25/07; all other strikes after 1901 have been nude strikes.

ST. HYACINTHE, QUEBEC (BOB McCABE) - Another example of the missing FE indicia; strike is dated AM/--16/95. The cover has a St. John; Quebec CDS dated AM/FE 16/95.

BELLEVILLE, ONTARIO, HMR I (BOB McCABE) - A new late date for this hammer, the strike is dated 2/FE 5/95.

GLENCOE, ONTARIO (JERRY CARR) - An indicia year error on a strike dated -/JA 6/87.

MILTON WEST, ONTARIO (DON FRASER) - Don sent a photo of a MILTON WEST CDS strike dated AM/NO 13/97. Don suggests the AM time mark was used exclusively with the CDS, which may explain why this time mark has not been reported for the squared circle hammer. Any thoughts on this would be greatly appreciated.

NORTH BAY, ONTARIO (BOB McCABE) - An additional report of the missing year date on a strike dated -/DE 18/-.

POWASSAN, ONTARIO (JACK GORDON) - The first reported use of a borrowed date indicia on a strike dated -/JAN 20/04.

GRENFELL, ASSA (JACK GORDON) - The handbook discussions about the use of a CDS cancel in 1899 are likely in error since Jack sent along about 20 Split Ring GRENFELL cancels from 1897-99. The Handbook reference to CDS cancels should state Split Ring cancels.

UNION, B.C. (JERRY CARR) - A new early date of use with a strike dated -/FE 8/94.

VICTORIA, B.C. HMR III (JERRY CARR) - The first reported strike on a 15 Cent Large Queen; the strike is dated PM/NO 19/97.

In response to the article in the October, 1984 ANNEX, members Jim Felton and Gerald Carr sent strikes of an OTTAWA CDS dated 3/AU 11/81 and an OTTAWA duplex cancel dated 2/AP 4/88. (The obliterator portion of a duplex hammer was generally an attachment to a dater and therefore a CDS cancel could have been used as a duplex instrument.)

With these in hand, there were now two examples of the OTTAWA CDS, one duplex cancel and one of the squared circle precursor available for comparison. Figure 1 below illustrates the methodology used in securing measurements of the lettering size and spacing and other cancel dimensions; the results of the comparisons are presented in Table 1.



#### UPDATE ON THE 1880 OTTAWA SQUARED CIRCLE (CONTINUED)

While the lettering spacing and diameter of the the instruments vary slightly, it is significant to note that the spread of the bottom legs of the letter "A" (measurement k-l and g-h) as well as the width of the base of the "W" (measurement i-j) are identical in each instance. Also, the height of the lettering is the same.

From the above comparisons, it is this writer's opinion that the 1880 OTTAWA squared Circle Precursor was indeed manufactured by Pritchard and Andrews, most likely as a circular date instrument and subsequently modified by adding horizontal bars to form the squared circle hammer. The only unanswered question is whether P & A performed the modification or perhaps another machine shop or even the Post Office Department itself made the changes.

Comments regarding the above are most welcome; perhaps those having strikes of the CDS or 1880 Squared Circle hammers could check the measurements using the basis set forth herein and forward the results to this writer for compilation.
