NEW REPORTS

We're short on beef this time; it's up to the members to supply the beef. For Arnprior, Cam Lindsay reports a 3c Jubilee cover with inverted month/day on -/JY 3/97. For Belleville Hmr. 3, Cam reports an inverted timemark on 4/AU 3/97 on Jubilee. For Belleville Hmr. I, Dave Kelly reports reversed date indicia on 2/11OC/94 on a 20c Weed (one of my favorite stamps for cancels). For Bowmanville, Dave reports a 3c small queen with early use of PM on PM/DE15/93

MOVING RIGHT ALONG WITH BOBCAYGEON

The proof strike shows indicia bars, and most examples of this town are without bars. Dave Kelly reports bars present on -/FE26/94 and no bars on -/MY18/94 and subsequently. However, a trace of bars is present on -/JU 5/94 probably due to a heavier impression. My own with-bars example on a 1c small queen is dated -/DE18/93. The 3d Edition Handbook reported a strike dated -/DE15/93. The proof strike shows the bars prominently, and weakly printing indicia, so that it may have been necessary to cut back the bars to obtain clear impressions. Thus this hammer exists in 3 states, not just the 2 described in the Handbook. Readers should send details of all strikes between FE26 and MY18, describing the appearance of the strike


CHECK LIST FOR SELECTED STAMPS

THE ORBS By Jim Miller Discussion 11: TORONTO STATION E

TORONTO-CANADA/STATION-E had only one orb hammer, but it creates some interesting problems. Firstly, the earliest dated strike I have is 8/AUG 30/06, a nice clear receiver on the address side of a post card from ONSLOW STATION/N.S. AU 28/06. Robert Smith in his "Ontario Post Offices" lists Station E's opening date as 1910-05-01, or possibly 1909-05-01. Either case must not be correct given my 1906 strike, along with another clear 1907 strike with another 1907 dated cancel on same post card.

A second curiosity is in the proof strike, dated 12/MAY 3/11 shown on page 154, Vol IX of the Lee/Hughes "Proof Strikes of Canada". This is five years later than the ERD. When one looks closely at the proof strike, you notice the outer ring is somewhat dented-odd for a new hammer. The hammer was probably damaged at the post office and returned for repairs. I have five examples dated after the MAY 3/11 proof date, all showing outer ring faults like the proof strike.

I have only 9 examples, and the odd report from other collectors. While the period of use was not overly short (1906-1915), this hammer is one of the scarce orbs.


Comments:

Only one hammer. A proof strike is shown in the Paul Hughes/ Robert Lee Proof Book Vol. IX, pg. 154 dated 12/MAY 3/11. This strike shows considerable damage to the outer ring, especially above TORONTO-CANADA. I have three examples prior to the proof date, there being no mistake it is the same hammer as confirmed by acetate overlay. Hence proof date must be unknown, and the 12/MAY 3/11 proof strike must be the same hammer returned for repairs.

Robert Smith ID Station E opened 1909 or 1910, Max Rosenthal says Station E opened in 1909. The Hughes/Lee Proofbook Vol. IX pg. 122 shows two Station E CDS cancels dated AP 22/10 & JUN 15/10.

1915 strikes show major wear, middle ring almost gone, gives appearance of a 2-ring orb. Use acetate overly for definite confirmation.
