NEW REPORTS

Precursor Hamilton - a 1A time mark on FE19, received from a dealer in British Columbia.

London - from the same source, a 10P time mark on MY19.

Montreal Hammer V - 10A time mark on a receiving strike JY 5/02, 2c + 5c cover from Kingston, supplied by Michel Morin.

Type One London - on several days in 1897 there is a miniature 7 in the day; dates in the editor's collection are 5/AU <u>7</u> and 5/SP <u>7</u>. Check your holdings for others.

Type Two Clifton - a new latest -/JU17/98 on 3c Leaf, reported by Dave Eisenhauer.

Halifax I - a couple odd indicia: blank above on OC21/96; 11 above on FE27/97, received from a dealer in British Coilumbia.

Montreal Hmr. I - there are no Jubilee covers recorded in the archive. Brian Copeland sent this picture of 5/AU22/1902 use on a lettercard to France with 1c and 3c making up the 5c rate.

Blyth - the cover in Jim Hennok's April sale is the fourth recorded; there are 2 covers in Nov. 93 plus a cover and a postcard in 94. The other Nov. 93 cover is dated -/NO 7/9 with a missing 3.

Grafton - the first 1899 report on -/MY20, 2c purple numeral, Joe Smith.

Hamilton - an unexpected 18/OC 8/13 strike on 8c Jubilee, received from an eBayer in Minn.

Oshawa - late use on -/SP15/94, partial strike on 1c submitted by new member Norm Wagner.

Port Arthur - 1906 usage as receivers on transatlantic picture postcard from Ayrshire, strike dated -/DE29, the Moffatt archive does not list any 06 strikes (error in 4th Edition Handbook).

Seelys Bay - the first 1900 report, poorly struck but identifiable on a postcard sent by Vic Willson dated ?/NO12/00 to Taunton MA, with a flag receiver dated NOV14/2-pm/1900.

Tilsonburg - late use of blank above on -R18/96 and early use of the PM timemark on AP 7/96, both in one of Jim Hennok's recent auction lots.

Vienna - the first 1903 report, -/JA 5, free strike on a 2c red cover, by Norm MacNeall
